Abstract: Provides for an affirmative defense for the crime of illegal possession of stolen firearms and amends the elements of this crime.

Present law provides for the crime of illegal possession of stolen firearms.

<u>Present law</u> provides that illegal possession of stolen firearms is the intentional possessing, procuring, receiving, or concealing of a firearm which has been the subject of any robbery or theft under circumstances which indicate that the offender knew or should have known that the firearm was the subject of a robbery or theft.

<u>Proposed law</u> changes the elements of the crime to include any misappropriation and not only robbery or theft.

<u>Proposed law</u> further provides that it shall be an affirmative defense to a prosecution for illegal possession of stolen firearms that the offender had no knowledge that the firearm was the subject of any form of misappropriation.

<u>Proposed law</u> further provides that it shall be an affirmative defense to a prosecution for illegal possession of stolen firearms that the alleged offender has or had possession of the firearm pursuant to his regular course of business, is in possession of a valid federal firearms license, is routinely in the possession of firearms for sale, pawn, lease, rent, repair, modification, or other legitimate acts as part of his normal scope of business operations, and is enforcing a privilege.
