2	To amend and reenact R.S. 14:62.8(B)(2), relative to the crime of home invasion; to provide

6	Section 1. R.S. 14:62.8(B)(2) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

12	imprisoned at hard labor for not less than five years nor more than thirty years.

14	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
15	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
16	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If

DIGEST

White (SB 313)

Present law defines and provides penalties for the crime of home invasion.

<u>Present law</u> provides that whoever commits the crime of home invasion armed with a dangerous weapon is to be fined up to \$7,000 and imprisoned at hard labor for up to 30 years.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds that whoever commits the crime of home invasion armed with a dangerous weapon is to be imprisoned for a minimum of five years. <u>Proposed law</u> otherwise retains <u>present law</u>.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
