MOTOR VEHICLES. Provides for driver's license renewal every six years. (8/1/14)

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. $32:412(A)(4)(a)$ and the introductory paragraph of (b) and (7)(a)
3	and the introductory paragraph of (b), $(B)(7)(a)(i)$ and the introductory paragraph of
4	(ii), (b)(i) and the introductory paragraph of (ii), (c)(i) and the introductory paragraph
5	of (ii), (d)(i) and the introductory paragraph of (ii), (e)(i)(aa), the introductory
6	paragraph of (bb), and (dd) and (ii)(aa), (bb), and (dd), and (C), relative to motor
7	vehicles; to provide for the duration of a driver's license; and to provide for related
8	matters.
9	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
10	Section 1. R.S. 32:412(A)(4)(a) and the introductory paragraph of (b) and (7)(a) and
11	the introductory paragraph of (b), (B)(7)(a)(i) and the introductory paragraph of (ii), (b)(i)
12	and the introductory paragraph of (ii), (c)(i) and the introductory paragraph of (ii), (d)(i) and
13	the introductory paragraph of (ii), (e)(i)(aa), the introductory paragraph of (bb), and (dd) and
14	(ii)(aa), (bb), and (dd), and (C), are hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

3	(4)(a) A Class "D" driver's license shall expire on the anniversary of the
4	birthday of the applicant which is nearest to a period of four six years subsequent to
5	the issuing of the license, unless suspended, revoked or canceled prior to that time.
6	(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of Subparagraph (a) of this Paragraph, the
7	department may issue the license for a period of less than four six years in
8	circumstances of medical limitation, limitation on lawful presence, or other special
9	restrictions. When the department issues a license to a properly documented alien
10	student or nonresident alien, the license shall both:

12	(7)(a) A Class "E" driver's license shall expire on the anniversary of the
13	birthday of the applicant which is nearest to a period of four six years subsequent to
14	the issuing of the license, unless suspended, revoked or canceled.

26	which is nearest to a date of four $\underline{six}$ years subsequent to the issuing of the license,
27	unless revoked, canceled, or suspended prior to that time.

expire on the anniversary of the birthday of the applicant which is nearest to a date
of four six years subsequent to the issuing of the license, unless revoked, canceled,
or suspended.

(bb) Notwithstanding the provisions of R.S. 32:412(B)(7)(e)(i)(aa), the
department may issue the license for a period of less than four six years in
circumstances of medical limitation, limitation on lawful presence, or other special
restrictions. When the department issues a license to a properly documented alien
student or nonresident alien, the license shall both:

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20 (dd)(I) Every applicant seventy years of age or older for a Class "D" driver's
21 license, or for the renewal of a Class "D" driver's license, except those bona fide
22 residents of the city of New Orleans, shall pay for such basic license a fee of fourteen
23 dollars and seventy-five cents, which shall be the cost of the license. The license
24 shall expire on the anniversary of the birthday of the applicant which is nearest to the
25 date of four six years subsequent to the issuing of the license, unless revoked,
26 canceled, or suspended.

(II) Notwithstanding the provisions of R.S. 32:412(B)(7)(e)(i)(dd)(I), the
department may issue the license for a period of less than four <u>six</u> years in
circumstances of medical limitation, limitation on lawful presence, or other special

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restriction. When the department issues a license to a properly documented alien student or nonresident alien, the license shall both expire on the date for which the alien's immigration documents expire, if sooner than the date specified in Subsubitem (I) of this Subitem, and contain a restriction code which declares that the license holder is an alien student or a nonresident alien.

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(ii)(aa) Every applicant seventy years of age or older for a Class "E" driver's
license, or for the renewal of a Class "E" driver's license, issued to bona fide
residents of the city of New Orleans, shall pay for such basic license a fee of four
dollars and fifty cents, which shall be the cost of the license. This license shall expire
on the anniversary of the birthday of the applicant which is nearest to a date of four
six years subsequent to the issuing of the license, unless revoked, canceled, or
suspended.

(bb) Notwithstanding the provisions of R.S. 32:412(B)(7)(e)(ii)(aa), the 14 department may issue the license for a period of less than four six years in 15 circumstances of medical limitation, limitation on lawful presence, or other special 16 restriction. When the department issues a license to a properly documented alien 17 student or nonresident alien, that license shall both expire on the date for which the 18 19 alien's immigration documents expire, if sooner than the date specified in Subitem 20 (aa) of this Item, and contain a restriction code which declares that the license holder 21 is an alien student or a nonresident alien.

(dd)(I) Every applicant seventy years of age or older for a Class "D" driver's
license, or for the renewal of a Class "D" driver's license, issued to bona fide
residents of the city of New Orleans, shall pay for such basic license a fee of
eighteen dollars and fifty cents, which shall be the cost of the license. This license
shall expire on the anniversary of the birthday of the applicant which is nearest to the
date of four six years subsequent to the issuing of the license, unless revoked,
canceled, or suspended.

1 (II) Notwithstanding the provisions of R.S.32:412(B)(7)(e)(ii)(dd)(I), the 2 department may issue the license for a period of less than four six years in circumstances of medical limitation, limitation on lawful presence, or other special 3 restriction. When the department issues a license to a properly documented alien 4 5 student or nonresident alien, the license shall both expire on the date for which the alien's immigration documents expire, if sooner than the date specified in 6 7 Subsubitem (I) of this Subitem, and contain a restriction code which declares that the 8 license holder is an alien student or a nonresident alien.

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10 C.(1) The addition of a motorcycle or motor scooter endorsement to a basic 11 license will require, besides the specific examination for such vehicles, the payment 12 of an additional fee of eight dollars. If the motorcycle endorsement is to any license 13 which is valid for less than four <u>six</u> years, the fee for the endorsement will be four 14 dollars.

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(2) Notwithstanding any provisions of law to the contrary and subject to the 15 exceptions contained in Article VII, Section 9(A) of the Constitution of Louisiana, 16 the amount of five dollars from the fee for a motorcycle or motor scooter 17 endorsement to a basic license, or the amount of two dollars from the fee if the 18 19 motorcycle endorsement for any person is to a license that is valid for only less than four six years shall be credited to the Bond Security and Redemption Fund. After a 20 21 sufficient amount is allocated from that fund to pay all obligations secured by the full faith and credit of the state which become due and payable within any fiscal years, 22 the treasurer shall pay an amount equal to the fees paid into the Bond Security and 23 Redemption Fund pursuant to this Paragraph into a special fund which is hereby 24 created in the state treasury and designated as the "Motorcycle Safety, Awareness, 25 and Operator Training Program Fund", hereinafter referred to as the "fund". The 26 27 monies credited to the fund shall be used solely for operator training, instructor training, and motorcycle safety and awareness programs. Any unexpended and 28 29 unencumbered monies remaining to the credit of the fund on June thirtieth of each

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year, after all appropriations of the preceding fiscal year have been made, shall revert
to the state general fund. The monies in the fund shall be expended solely from year
to year as appropriated by the legislature for the purposes of motorcycle safety and
awareness and operator training. Any amounts earned through investment of the
monies in the fund shall revert to the state general fund.

## DIGEST

### Claitor (SB 582)

<u>Present law</u> provides that the duration of all classes of a driver's license is four years.

<u>Proposed law</u> changes the duration of all classes of a driver's license to six years.
