2	To amend and reenact R.S. 40:1472.2(7)(d) and to enact R.S. 40:1472.2(7)(e), relative to the

5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 40:1472.2(7)(d) is hereby amended and reenacted and R.S.
7	40:1472.2(7)(e) is hereby enacted to read as follows:
8	§1472.2. Definitions

10	(7) "Explosives" means any chemical compound, mixture, or device, the
11	primary or common purpose of which is to function by explosion. The term includes
12	but is not limited to dynamite and other high explosives, black powder in quantities
13	in excess of five pounds, pellet powder, initiating explosives, detonators, safety
14	fuses, squibs, detonating cord, igniter cord, and igniters. The term "explosives"
15	further includes but is not limited to the following:

17	(d) The Except as provided for in Subparagraph (e) of this Paragraph the
18	term "explosive" shall not include smokeless powder when used in sporting arms.
19	(e) "Exploding or explosive target" means two or more mixed, commercially
20	manufactured prepackaged chemical substances including oxidizers, flammable

liquids or solids, or similar substances that are not independently classified as
explosives but which when mixed or combined in quantities greater than five pounds
form a mixture that is classified as an explosive and designed primarily as a target

St. Germain HB No. 160

Abstract: Adds "exploding or explosive target" to the definition of explosives.

Present law provides for the regulation and licensing of explosives.

<u>Present law</u> provides for licensing of manufacturers, dealer-distributors, users, blasters, and handlers of explosives.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds "exploding or explosive target" to the definition of explosives.

Proposed law defines "exploding or explosive target".

 $\underline{\text{Proposed law}}$ requires licensing only for exploding or explosive targets in quantities greater than five pounds.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Administration of Criminal Justice</u> to the <u>original</u> bill.

1. Deleted definition of "binary explosive target" and added a definition of "exploding or explosive target".

House Floor Amendments to the engrossed bill.

1. Defined "exploding or explosive target" to only include mixed substances that when combined amount to quantities greater than five pounds.
