SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 75

BY SENATOR NEVERS

HEALTH/HOSPITALS DEPT. Requests that DHH study and develop a list of best practices suicide prevention training programs to make available in Louisiana to offer for training groups of Louisiana professionals and citizens on a voluntary basis.

1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
2	To urge and request the Louisiana Department of Health and Hospitals, through its office
3	of behavioral health, to study and develop a list of suicide assessment, intervention,
4	treatment, and management training programs meeting the Suicide Prevention
5	Resource Center best practices standards to make available for access by medical
6	professionals and the public in the state of Louisiana; that the department further
7	develop a list of which other professional and citizen groups, beyond the medical
8	professions, the department recommends should be offered such training on a
9	voluntary basis; and that the department recommends how best to make such training
10	widely accessible for use in Louisiana, through online access or otherwise.
11	WHEREAS, suicide is the tenth leading cause of death in the United States of
12	America; and
13	WHEREAS, suicide kills more people in this country each year than automobile
14	accidents; and
15	WHEREAS, in 2012, twelve out of every one hundred thousand people in Louisiana
16	committed suicide; and
17	WHEREAS, early detection and competent care in the treatment of suicidal thoughts
18	can save lives; and

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1	WHEREAS, in 2005, a study conducted in the state of Georgia demonstrated that a
2	group of mental health professionals without best practices suicide prevention training
3	demonstrated a nine-percent group average competency rate in suicide assessment and
4	intervention, and, after only a minimal number of hours of such empirically-supported
5	training, the group's average competency rate in suicide assessment and intervention rose to
6	eighty-nine percent; and

WHEREAS, the Louisiana Department of Health and Hospitals is currently making
available to many state agency personnel best practices, empirically-supported training in
suicide assessment, intervention, treatment, and management; and

WHEREAS, many evidence-based, successful suicide prevention training programs
 are available online and otherwise at minimal cost through organizations such as the
 nationally recognized Suicide Prevention Resource Center and the American Foundation for
 Suicide Prevention; and

WHEREAS, in addition to Louisiana's medical professionals and professions such
 as educators and law enforcement, other civic or citizen groups, such as students, could
 benefit from such suicide assessment and intervention training.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby 17 18 urge and request the Department of Health and Hospitals, through its office of behavioral 19 health, to study and develop a list of suicide assessment, intervention, treatment, and 20 management training programs meeting the Suicide Prevention Resource Center best 21 practices standards to make available for access by medical professionals and the public in 22 the state of Louisiana; that the department further develop a list of which other professional 23 and citizen groups, beyond the medical professions, the department recommends should be 24 offered such training on a voluntary basis; and that the department recommend how best to 25 make such training widely accessible for use in Louisiana, through online access or otherwise. 26

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby urge and request the Department of Health and Hospitals complete this study and deliver a written report with its findings and recommendations to the health and welfare committees of the Louisiana Senate and House of Representatives on or before January 1, 2015.

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# BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the
