<u>Present law</u> restricts the state Sanitary Code and any commercial food preparation code, law, or regulation from applying to the preparation of jellies, preserves, jams, honey, honeycomb products, cakes, and cookies by home-based preparers in their home for sale as long as gross annual sales are less than \$20,000. <u>Proposed law</u> expands <u>present law</u> to include home-based preparers of pies. <u>Proposed law</u> provides that the term "pie" shall not include any food or food product containing animal proteins or fish proteins.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental expenditures as a result of this measure. The proposed legislation exempts home preparers of pies from the requirements of the state Sanitary Code. Presently, the Office of Public Health (OPH) within the Department of Health and Hospitals (DHH) performs retail food inspections of businesses applying for a retail food permit, however OPH does not perform inspections of personal residencies.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

It is anticipated that self-generated revenues within OPH will decrease by an indeterminable amount as a result of this legislation. The current permitting fee for retail food establishments is \$100. The current maximum civil fine for violations of the Sanitary Code relative to food preparation is \$100 per day per violation; however, there is a penalty cap of \$10,000 per year relative to the assessment of civil fines. With the application of this legislation, OPH would lose all revenues associated with home-based preparers of pies listed in proposed law (R.S. 40:4.9) relative to permitting fees and penalties.
