FIRE PROTECT/FIREMEN: Provides relative to financial security benefits for surviving spouses and children of fire operation personnel

1	AN ACT
2	To enact R.S. 33:1981.1 and 2201(B)(introductory paragraph) and (22), relative to financial
3	benefits for surviving spouses and children of fire operation personnel; to provide
4	for financial security for surviving spouses and children of enforcement and
5	emergency service personnel of the office of the state fire marshal; to provide for
6	financial security for surviving spouses and children of firemen upon death by heart
7	attack or stroke; to create a presumption; and to provide for related matters.
8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
9	Section 1. R.S. 33:1981.1 and 2201(B)(introductory paragraph) and (22) are hereby
10	enacted to read as follows:
11	§1981.1. Financial security for surviving spouses and children of firemen; death by
12	heart attack or stroke; presumption
13	A. In addition to the qualifying events enumerated in R.S. 33:1981, a
14	fireman whose death is the direct and proximate result of a heart attack or a stroke
15	shall be presumed to have died as the direct and proximate result of an injury
16	sustained in the performance of his official duties for the purposes of R.S. 33:1981
17	<u>if:</u>
18	(1) While on duty, the fireman engaged in an activity which was stressful or
19	physical including but not limited to fire suppression, rescue, hazardous material

1	response, emergency medical services, disaster relief, or other emergency response
2	activity, or participated in a training exercise that involved stressful or strenuous
3	physical activity.
4	(2) The fireman died as a result of a heart attack or stroke suffered while
5	engaging or participating, or on duty after engaging or participating, in the activities
6	or exercises described in Paragraph (1) of this Subsection or no later than twenty-
7	four hours after engaging or participating in the activities or exercises described in
8	Paragraph (1) of this Subsection.
9	B. The presumption created by this Section shall be irrebuttable despite
10	medical evidence to the contrary.
11	C. The surviving spouse and children of a fireman whose death meets the
12	requirements under Subsection A of this Section shall be eligible for the payment of
13	benefits enumerated in R.S. 33:1981.
14	D. Payment of benefits pursuant to this Section shall be made according to
15	the provisions of R.S. 33:1981 and shall be subject to review by the Law
16	Enforcement Officers and Firemen's Survivor Benefit Review Board.
17	E. Payments pursuant to this Section shall be made by the state risk manager
18	from the Self-Insurance Fund provided for in R.S. 39:1533.

Abstract: Provides for financial security for surviving spouses and children of enforcement and emergency service personnel of the office of the state fire marshal and provides for financial security for surviving spouses and children of firemen upon death by heart attack or stroke.

<u>Present law</u> provides for financial security, in certain cases, for surviving spouses and children of firemen or officers who suffer death as a result of an injury arising out of and in the course of the performance of his official duties as a fireman or officer, or arising out of any activity while on or off duty, in his capacity as a fireman or officer, in the protection of life and property. Further provides for the definition of firemen and law enforcement officers.

Proposed law retains present law.

<u>Proposed law</u> adds all enforcement and emergency services personnel of the office of the state fire marshal to <u>present law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for financial security for surviving spouses and children of firemen upon death by heart attack or stroke during or within a specified time after engaging in certain activities undertaken while on duty.
