FUNDS/FUNDING: Authorizes certain statutorily dedicated funds to be used for special law enforcement initiatives

AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 11:545(D), R.S. 15:598, R.S. 22:831(B), R.S. 40:1379.3.1(D) and 3 1379.7(B), and Code of Criminal Procedure Article 895.1(F)(3)(a), relative to special 4 treasury funds; to provide for the uses of the Department of Public Safety Police 5 Officers Fund, the Criminal Identification and Information Fund, the Louisiana State 6 Police Salary Fund, the Concealed Handgun Permit Fund, the Public Safety DWI 7 Testing, Maintenance, and Training Fund, and the Sex Offender Registry 8 Technology Fund; to authorize the use of certain monies in such funds for special 9 law enforcement initiatives; and to provide for related matters. 10 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: 11 Section 1. R.S. 11:545(D) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows: 12 §545. Department of Public Safety Peace Officers Fund 13 14 D. The monies in the fund shall be used for funding retirement benefits for 15 peace officers, as defined in R.S. 40:2402(1)(a), employed by the Department of 16 Public Safety and Corrections, office of state police, other than state troopers. Any 17 monies in the fund not used for retirement benefits as provided in this Section may 18 be used for special law enforcement initiatives and to support the operations of the 19 Department of Public Safety and Corrections, Capitol Complex Police Force. 20 21 Section 2. R.S. 15:598 is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

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§598. Criminal Identification and Information Fund

All fees imposed and collected pursuant to R.S. 15:587 or any other provision of law in this Chapter shall be forwarded upon receipt to the state treasurer for immediate deposit into the state treasury. After compliance with the requirements of Article VII, Section 9(B) of the Constitution of Louisiana relative to the Bond Security and Redemption Fund, and prior to monies being placed in the state general fund, an amount equal to that deposited as required in this Section shall be credited to a special fund hereby created in the state treasury designated as the Criminal Identification and Information Fund. All monies in this fund shall annually be appropriated by the legislature to the state police, may be withdrawn only pursuant to such appropriation, and shall be used solely and exclusively by the state police to assist in carrying out the provisions of this Chapter and for special law enforcement initiatives. Monies in the fund shall be invested by the state treasurer in the same manner as monies in the state general fund. Interest earned on the investment of monies shall be credited to this fund following compliance with the requirements of Article VII, Section 9(B) relative to the Bond Security and Redemption Fund. All unexpended and unencumbered monies in the fund at the end of each fiscal year shall remain in the fund.

Section 3. R.S. 22:831(B) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

§831. Fire, marine, transportation, casualty, surety, or other insurance

21 * * *

B. There is hereby created in the state treasury the Louisiana State Police Salary Fund. Monies in the Louisiana State Police Salary Fund shall be used in amounts appropriated by the legislature to cover the cost of salary increases and related benefits for members of the state police service and for special law enforcement initiatives. Taxes collected under the provisions of this Section in Fiscal Year 2002-2003 and ensuing fiscal years that are in excess of total collections under the provisions of this Section in Fiscal Year 2000-2001, after first having been credited to the Bond Security and Redemption Fund as required by Article VII,

1	Section 9(B) of the Louisiana Constitution, shall be deposited into the Louisiana
2	State Police Salary Fund until the amount deposited in each fiscal year is equal to
3	fifteen million six hundred thousand dollars.

15	B. After compliance with the requirements of Article VII, Section 9(B) of
16	the Constitution of Louisiana relative to the Bond Security and Redemption Fund,
17	and prior to monies being placed in the state general fund, the treasurer shall credit
18	an amount equal to the total amount of such costs received to a special fund which
19	is hereby created in the state treasury and designated as the Public Safety DWI
20	Testing, Maintenance, and Training Fund. The monies in the described fund shall
21	be used solely to fund activities of the office of state police in executing its
22	responsibilities in the purchase and maintenance of equipment and supplies for use
23	in breath, blood, or urine analysis as related to violations of R.S. 14:98 or 98.1;
24	training in the maintenance and usage of testing equipment; and other such related
25	expenses as may be necessary in the efficient and effective administration of those
26	duties; and for special law enforcement initiatives. The monies in the fund shall be
27	used only in the amounts appropriated by the legislature. All unexpended and
28	unencumbered monies in the fund at the end of the fiscal year shall remain in the
29	fund. The monies in the fund shall be invested by the treasurer in the same manner

1	as monies in the state general fund. All interest earned on monies in the fund
2	invested by the treasurer shall be credited to the Public Safety DWI Testing,
3	Maintenance, and Training Fund.

5	Section 5. Code of Criminal Procedure Article 895.1(F)(3)(a) is hereby amended and
6	reenacted to read as follows:
7	Art. 895.1. Probation; restitution; judgment for restitution; fees

9	F. When the court places the defendant on supervised probation, it shall
10	order as a condition of probation the payment of a monthly fee of eleven dollars.
11	The monthly fee established in this Paragraph shall be in addition to the fee
12	established in Paragraph C of this Article and shall be collected by the Department
13	of Public Safety and Corrections and shall be transmitted, deposited, appropriated,
14	and used in accordance with the following provisions:

16	(3) The monies in the Sex Offender Registry Technology Fund shall be
17	appropriated as follows:
18	(a) For Fiscal Year 2006-2007, the amount of one hundred ninety thousand
19	dollars to the Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of state police, to
20	be used in the administration of programs for the registration of sex offenders in
21	compliance with federal and state laws, and support of community notification
22	efforts by local law enforcement agencies. For Fiscal Years 2007-2008 through
23	2009-2010, the amount to be appropriated under this Subparagraph shall be twenty-
24	five thousand dollars. For Fiscal Years 2010-2011, and thereafter, the amount to be
25	appropriated to the Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of state
26	police, shall be twenty-five thousand dollars for the purposes of maintaining and
27	administering the programs for the registration of sex offenders pursuant to this
28	Subparagraph and special law enforcement initiatives.

Ivey HB No. 726

Abstract: Permits monies in certain special treasury funds dedicated to the office of state police for specific purposes to also be used for special law enforcement initiatives. The funds are: the Dept. of Public Safety Peace Officers Fund, the Criminal Identification and Information Fund, the Concealed Handgun Permit Fund, the Public Safety DWI Testing, Maintenance, and Training Fund, and the Sex Offender Registry Technology Fund.

<u>Present law</u> provides that monies in the Dept. of Public Safety Peace Officers Fund shall be used for funding retirement benefits for peace officers employed by office of state police other than state troopers. Any monies in the fund not used for retirement benefits may be used to support the operations of the Capitol Complex Police Force.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and additionally permits any monies in the fund not used for retirement benefits to be used for special law enforcement initiatives.

<u>Present law</u> provides that monies in the Criminal Identification and Information Fund shall be used solely and exclusively by the state police to assist in carrying out the provisions of <u>present law</u> regarding the Louisiana Bureau of Criminal Identification and Information.

<u>Proposed law</u> additionally permits the fund to be used by state police for special law enforcement initiatives.

<u>Present law</u> provides that money in the Louisiana State Police Salary Fund shall be used to cover the cost of salary increases and related benefits for members of state police.

<u>Proposed law</u> additionally permits monies in the fund to be used for special law enforcement initiatives.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the monies in the Concealed Handgun Permit Fund shall be used solely for administration of the concealed handgun permit process.

<u>Proposed law</u> additionally permits monies in the fund to be used for special law enforcement initiatives.

<u>Present law</u> provides that monies in the Public Safety DWI Testing, Maintenance, and Training Fund shall be used solely to fund activities of the office of state police in executing its responsibilities in the purchase and maintenance of equipment and supplies for use in breath, blood, or urine analysis as related to certain violations; training in the maintenance and usage of testing equipment; and other such related expenses as may be necessary in the efficient and effective administration of those duties.

<u>Proposed law</u> additionally permits monies in the fund to be used to fund activities of the office of state police for special law enforcement initiatives.

<u>Present law</u> provides for distributions out of the Sex Offender Registration Technology Fund. Provides that \$25,000 shall be distributed annually to the office of state police for the purposes of maintaining and administering the programs for the registration of sex offenders.

<u>Proposed law</u> permits the allocation for state police to also be used for special law enforcement initiatives.
