DIGEST

<u>Present law</u> authorizes certain religious officials to perform marriage ceremonies when authorized by the authorities of his religion and when he is registered to perform marriages.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and requires the religious official to have attained the age of majority.

<u>Present law</u> provides that an officiant authorized to perform marriage ceremonies in the parish of Orleans may waive the seventy-two hour delay for nonresident parties upon application of the parties giving serious and meritorious reasons.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that an officiant authorized to perform marriage ceremonies may waive the seventy-two hour delay for nonresident parties upon application of the parties giving serious and meritorious reasons.

Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Judiciary A to the engrossed bill

1. Removes language that provides that only officiants authorized to perform marriage ceremonies in Orleans Parish may waive the 72-hour delay for nonresident parties under certain circumstances, and instead provides that any officiant authorized to perform marriage ceremonies may waive the 72-hour delay for nonresident parties under certain circumstances.
