## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 124

BY SENATOR THOMPSON

FARMING. Establishes and provides for a group to study the use of Unmanned Aerial Vehicles for agricultural purposes.

1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
2	To establish and provide for a group to study the use and application of Unmanned Aerial
3	Vehicles ("UAVS" or "drones") for agricultural purposes and to recommend any
4	action or legislation that the study group deems necessary or appropriate.
5	WHEREAS, the Association for Unmanned Vehicle Systems International predicts
6	that eighty percent of the commercial market for drones will eventually be for agricultural
7	uses; and
8	WHEREAS, once the Federal Aviation Administration establishes guidelines for
9	commercial use, the drone industry expects more than one hundred thousand jobs to be
10	created and nearly half a billion in tax revenue to be generated by 2025, much of it from
11	agriculture purposes; and
12	WHEREAS, drones equipped with infrared cameras, sensors and other technology
13	collect invaluable data which can identify insect problems, spot watering issues, assess crop
14	yields and track down cattle that have wandered off; and
15	WHEREAS, farmers can also use drones to tailor their use of pesticides, herbicides,
16	fertilizer and other applications, known as precision agriculture, which saves the grower
17	from unnecessarily overusing resources, while at the same time reducing the amount of
18	runoff into nearby rivers and streams; and

1	WHEREAS, there are many areas of concern in the UAV agriculture industry yet to
2	be addressed or studied including risks to crop dusters and the need for visual markers,
3	registration, licensing, and enforcement requirements, limits on altitude and size, flight plan
4	registration, and training courses; and
5	WHEREAS, a study of these issues and concerns is essential for the continued
6	development and success of this sector of Louisiana's agricultural economy.
7	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana hereby creates
8	the Agriculture Unmanned Aerial Vehicle Study Group to study the use and application of
9	UAVS or drones for agricultural purposes and to recommend any action or legislation that
10	the study group deems necessary or appropriate.
11	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the study group created herein shall include the
12	following members:
13	(1) The vice president of agriculture from Louisiana State University or his
14	designee.
15	(2) The chancellor of the Southern University Agricultural Center or his
16	designee.
17	(3) The president of the University of Louisiana at Monroe or his designee.
18	(4) A representative from the Louisiana Association of Independent Colleges
19	and Universities.
20	(5) The commissioner of the Department of Agriculture and Forestry or his
21	designee.
22	(6) A representative of the Louisiana Agriculture Aviation Association.
23	(7) A representative of the Louisiana Landowners Association, Inc.
24	(8) A representative of the Louisiana Agriculture Consultants Association.
25	(9) A representative of the Louisiana Forestry Association.
26	(10) The president of Louisiana Farm Bureau or his designee.
27	(11) A representative from the Federal Aviation Administration.
28	(12) The chair of the Senate Committee on Agriculture, Forestry, Aquaculture and

2	(14) The chairman may appoint additional members as deemed appropriate.
3	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members of the study group shall serve
4	without compensation, except per diem or expenses reimbursement to which they may be
5	individually entitled as members of the constituent organizations.
6	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a majority of the total membership shall
7	constitute a quorum and any official action by the study group shall require an affirmative
8	vote of a majority of the quorum present and voting.
9	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the study group shall elect a chair at the first
10	meeting and may conduct such meetings at such times as it may deem necessary or
11	convenient to accomplish the objectives and purposes of this Resolution.
12	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in the event that the study group makes a report
13	of its findings and recommendations, with suggestions for proposed legislation, if any, such
14	report shall be made to the legislature no later than sixty days prior to the convening of the
15	2015 Regular Session.

#### DIGEST

Thompson (SCR 124)

Establishes the Agriculture Unmanned Aerial Vehicle Study Group to study the use and application of UAVS or drones for agricultural purposes.

The study group consists of the following members, or their designees:

- (1) The vice president of agriculture from Louisiana State University or his designee.
- (2) The chancellor of the Southern University Agricultural Center or his designee.
- (3) The president of the University of Louisiana at Monroe or his designee.
- (4) A representative from the Louisiana Association of Independent Colleges and Universities.
- (5) The commissioner of the Department of Agriculture and Forestry or his designee.
- (6) A representative of the Louisiana Agriculture Aviation Association.
- (7) A representative of the Louisiana Landowners Association, Inc.
- (8) A representative of the Louisiana Agriculture Consultants Association.

- (9) A representative of the Louisiana Forestry Association.
- (10) The president of Louisiana Farm Bureau or his designee.
- (11) A representative from the Federal Aviation Administration.
- (12) The chair of the Senate Committee on Agriculture, Forestry, Aquaculture and Rural Development or his designee.
- (13) The chair of the House Committee on Agriculture, Forestry, Aquaculture and Rural Development or his designee.
- (14) The chairman may appoint additional members as deemed appropriate.

Further provides that the study group shall elect a chair at the first meeting and may conduct such meetings at such times as it may deem necessary or convenient to accomplish its objectives and purposes.

Further provides that members of the study group shall receive no additional compensation for their services on the study group, except per diem or expenses reimbursement to which they may be individually entitled as members of the constituent organizations.

Further provides that any report of findings and recommendations is to be made no later than 60 days prior to the convening of the 2015 Regular Session.
