HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 129

CIVIL/CLAIMS: Authorizes the Louisiana State Law Institute to study the collateral source rule

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

2	To authorize and direct the Louisiana State Law Institute to study and make
3	recommendations relative to the collateral source rule as it relates to awards for
4	damages for medical expenses.
5	WHEREAS, the collateral source rule generally provides that a tortfeasor may not
6	benefit, and an injured plaintiff's recovery may not be diminished, because of benefits
7	received by the plaintiff from sources independent of the tortfeasor's contribution; and
8	WHEREAS, medical providers can reduce their medical charges through contractual
9	negotiation with healthcare insurers providing coverage to the injured plaintiff; and
10	WHEREAS, awards for damages for medical expenses to the injured plaintiff can
11	include the unreduced charges of the medical provider, and neither the healthcare insurer nor
12	the injured plaintiff are obligated to pay the difference between the original, unreduced
13	charges for services rendered by a medical provider and the contractually reduced charges
14	actually paid by the healthcare insurer.
15	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
16	authorize and direct the Louisiana State Law Institute to study the collateral source rule and
17	make recommendations for legislation regarding the recovery of medical expense damages
18	which the injured plaintiff is not obligated to pay.
19	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a suitable copy of this Resolution be transmitted
20	to the director of the Louisiana State Law Institute.
