2	To amend and reenact R.S. 14:403.4(B), (C)(1), and (D)(2), relative to offenses affecting
3	law enforcement; to provide relative to reports of burn injuries to the office of state
4	fire marshal; and to provide for related matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 14:403.4(B), (C)(1), and (D)(2) are hereby amended and reenacted
7	to read as follows:
8	§403.4. Burn injuries and wounds; reports; registry; immunity; penalties
9	* * *
10	B. In every Every case of a burn injury or wound in which the victim
11	sustains second or third degree burns to five percent or more of the body or any
12	burns to the upper respiratory tract or laryngeal edema due to the inhalation of super-
13	heated air, and every case of a burn injury or wound which that is likely to or may
14	result in death shall be reported to the office of state fire marshal, code enforcement
15	and building safety, hereinafter sometimes referred to as the "office". That The
16	office shall then immediately may notify the appropriate local or state investigatory
17	agency or law enforcement agency of the receipt of such report and its contents.
18	C.(1) An oral $\underline{\mathbf{A}}$ report shall be made within twenty-four $\underline{\mathbf{two}}$ hours of the
19	initial examination or treatment of the victim. The report shall be made by the
20	physician attending or treating the case, or by the manager, superintendent, director
21	or other person in charge whenever such case is treated in a hospital, burn center,
22	sanitarium, or other medical facility. The report may be recorded electronically or
23	in any other suitable manner, by the office of state fire marshal, code enforcement
24	and building safety.

1 2 D. 3 (2) The office of state fire marshal, code enforcement and building safety, 4 may adopt rules and regulations as may be necessary in carrying out the provisions 5 of this Section.
