HOUSE SUMMARY OF SENATE AMENDMENTS

House Bill No. 5 by Representative Pearson

RETIREMENT/MUNICIPAL EMP: Provides relative to the composition of the board of trustees of the Municipal Employees Retirement System

Synopsis of Senate Amendments

1. Makes a technical correction in <u>present law</u>.

Digest of Bill as Finally Passed by Senate

<u>Present law</u> creates the 11-member board of trustees of the MERS system. Of these 11 members, five are ex officio and six are active contributing members elected by the membership of the system. <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires three of the active member trustees to be elected officials and the other three to not be elected officials (hereafter referred to as regular members).

<u>Present law</u> requires all elected trustees to be elected in accordance with the election rules prescribed by the board. <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u>.

<u>Present law</u> authorizes all ex officio members of the board except the President of the La. Municipal Assoc. to designate someone to serve in their place. <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and further authorizes the president of the La. Municipal Assoc. to designate someone to serve in his place.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes a trustee, once elected, to continue to serve on the board if he remains a member of the system, regardless of a change in employment which would otherwise render him ineligible for the position held.

<u>Present law</u> generally provides that a trustee's term shall expire if he separates from membership of the system. <u>Proposed law</u> provides that a trustee's term shall expire if he ceases to be a member of the system. <u>Present law</u> provides an exception for members who retire while serving on the board. <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u>.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 11:1732(14)) defines "participating employer" for the laws of the system as:

- (1) Any incorporated city, town, or village in the state of Louisiana.
- (2) The Municipal Association of Louisiana.
- (3) The Louisiana Energy and Power Authority.
- (4) The Cajundome Commission.
- (5) The retirement system itself.
- (6) Any state planning and development commission that has entered into an agreement with the board for participation.
- (7) The West Calcasieu Parish Community Center Authority.
- (8) The Vinton Public Power Authority.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u>. <u>Proposed law</u> prohibits more than two trustees from the same participating employer from serving on the board at the same time.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for implementation of <u>proposed law</u>. Requires the trustees elected in 2016, 2017, and 2020 to be elected officials and the trustees elected in 2015, 2018, and 2019 to be regular members. Requires vacancies in a trustee position once the position is filled pursuant to <u>proposed law</u> to be filled according to the classification of the trustee who held the position immediately prior: elected official trustees shall be replaced with other elected officials and regular member trustees shall be replaced by other regular members. Authorizes a vacancy in a position that has not yet held an election pursuant to <u>proposed law</u> to be filled by either elected official or regular members.
