HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 173

STUDENT/LOANS-SCHOLARSHP: Requests that the Bd. of Regents, in collaboration with the Taylor Foundation, La. Office of Student Financial Assistance, public postsecondary education management boards, State Bd. of Elementary and Secondary Education, and certain others, study certain issues relative to TOPS

1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
2	To urge and request the Board of Regents, in collaboration with the Patrick F. Taylor
3	Foundation, the Louisiana Office of Student Financial Assistance, each public
4	postsecondary education management board, the State Board of Elementary and
5	Secondary Education, Louisiana Department of Economic Development, the
6	Louisiana Workforce Commission, the Louisiana Association of Business and
7	Industry, and any other entity the Board of Regents deems appropriate, to study
8	certain issues relative to the Taylor Opportunity Program for Students (TOPS) and
9	to submit a written report of findings and conclusions, including any
10	recommendations for related legislation, to the House Committee on Education and
11	the Senate Committee on Education not later than sixty days prior to the beginning
12	of the 2015 Regular Session of the Legislature of Louisiana.
13	WHEREAS, current law provides for the Taylor Opportunity Program for Students
14	(TOPS) as a program of merit scholarships for students attending certain postsecondary
15	education institutions who meet a specific grade point average, ACT score, and core
16	curriculum requirements and certain other qualifications; and
17	WHEREAS, there is a need to create a better alignment between the abilities of
18	college graduates and the needs of business and industry; and
19	WHEREAS, there is some concern that many students are not equipped with the
20	knowledge they need in terms of qualifying for initial TOPS eligibility, maintaining such

eligibility throughout college, and pursuing courses of study that will best enable them to
 have successful careers in Louisiana; and

WHEREAS, sustaining a well-educated, highly skilled, and productive workforce
is critical to the economic growth of this state; and

5 WHEREAS, every effort must be made to address the current and future workforce
6 needs of the state and to empower TOPS recipients to succeed both in college and in the
7 workforce.

8 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby 9 urge and request the Board of Regents, in collaboration with the Patrick F. Taylor 10 Foundation, the Louisiana Office of Student Financial Assistance, each public postsecondary 11 education management board, the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education, 12 Louisiana Department of Economic Development, the Louisiana Workforce Commission, 13 the Louisiana Association of Business and Industry, and any other entity the Board of 14 Regents deems appropriate, to study certain issues relative to the Taylor Opportunity 15 Program for Students (TOPS), which shall include but need not be limited to the following: 16 (1) Measures that may be taken in order to align the granting of TOPS awards with 17 the meeting of Louisiana's workforce needs.

(2) Facilitating the efforts of guidance counselors with respect to counseling students
about TOPS before they enter high school and while they are in high school.

20 (3) Establishing a "Total Louisiana" workforce counseling program in which each 21 high school student receives personalized guidance counseling on how his skills and 22 aptitudes, as indicated by standardized tests and any other evaluation tool, best align with 23 Louisiana employment opportunities, as indicated by the Louisiana Workforce 24 Commission's evaluation of areas of economic growth, and a career plan is developed for 25 the student such that the TOPS scholarship can be invested in an education path that meets 26 the needs of Louisiana's economy and leads to lifelong employment and residency in 27 Louisiana.

(4) The cost of TOPS thus far and projected future costs, degrees obtained by TOPS
recipients, the number of TOPS recipients who lose their awards, and the number of TOPS
recipients who do not graduate.

1 (5) Relative to TOPS-Tech, the feasibility of lowering the minimum ACT score required for initial eligibility and eliminating chemistry courses from the core curriculum 2 3 required for initial eligibility. 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Regents shall submit a written 5 report of findings and conclusions, including any recommendations for related legislation, 6 to the House Committee on Education and the Senate Committee on Education not later than 7 sixty days prior to the beginning of the 2015 Regular Session of the Legislature of Louisiana. 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a suitable copy of this Resolution be transmitted 9 to the chairman of the Board of Regents, the commissioner of higher education, Phyllis M. 10 Taylor, the executive director of the Louisiana Office of Student Financial Assistance, the 11 chairman of each public postsecondary education management board, the president of the 12 State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education, the secretary of the Louisiana 13 Department of Economic Development, the executive director of the Louisiana Workforce 14 Commission, and the president of the Louisiana Association of Business and Industry.
