8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
9	Section 1. R.S. 33:381(C)(33) is hereby enacted to read as follows:
10	§381. Municipal officers

14	$\underline{(33)(a)(i)\ Notwith standing\ any\ other\ provision\ of\ law\ to\ the\ contrary, the}$
15	council of the town of Sorrento may, upon the recommendation of the mayor,
16	adopt an ordinance calling for an election to abolish the office of chief of police,
17	the police department, or both. The election shall be held in accordance with the
18	Louisiana Election Code.
19	(ii) If a majority of the qualified electors voting at such election vote to
20	abolish the office of chief of police, the office shall be abolished upon the end of
21	the term of the chief of police in office at the time or when a vacancy occurs in
22	the office, whichever occurs first; however, if at the time the election occurs the
23	office is filled by an officer temporarily appointed, the abolition of the office
24	shall become effective as provided by ordinance.
25	(iii) If a majority of the qualified electors voting at such election vote to
26	abolish the police department, the abolition of the department shall become

SB NO. 601 ENROLLED 1 effective as provided by ordinance. 2 (b) If the office of chief of police is abolished or the municipal police 3 department is abolished, or both, the mayor and council may contract, or enter 4 into a cooperative endeavor, with any law enforcement entity or officer within 5 Ascension Parish for police services for the town. 6 7 Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not 8 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If 9 10 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become 11 effective on the day following such approval.
