Creates the Personal Online Account Privacy Protection Act

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The proposed legislation creates the Personal Online Account Privacy Protection Act which protects an employee or an applicant for employment from an employer's request for access to an employee's or applicant's personal online account. The bill defines "personal online account" as an online account used primarily or exclusively for personal communications. The proposed legislation also prohibits an employer from discharging, disciplining, failing to hire, or otherwise penalize or threaten to penalize an employee or applicant for failure to grant access to the employee's or applicant's personal online account. However, the bill states that an employer is not prohibited or restricted from requiring an employee to provide a personal e-mail address to facilitate communication with the employee, in the event the employer's e-mail system fails. The bill also prohibits public and private educational institutions from requesting or requiring a student or prospective student to disclose information allowing access to the student's or prospective student's personal online account. The bill also prohibits expelling, disciplining, failing to admit, or otherwise penalizing or threatening to penalize a student or prospective student for failure to disclose such information. These protections do not apply to electronic devices/accounts/services paid for or provided by employers or educational institutions excluding devices given to students.
