9	driver's licenses; to provide that driver's licenses be renewed every six years; to
10	provide for fees; to provide for the distribution of revenue; to create and provide for
11	special funds; and to provide for related matters.

17 C.(1) The addition of a motorcycle or motor scooter endorsement to a basic
18 license will require, besides the specific examination for such vehicles, the payment
19 of an additional fee of eight twelve dollars. If the motorcycle endorsement is to any
20 license which is valid for less than four six years, the fee for the endorsement will
21 be four dollars.

22 (2) Notwithstanding any provisions of law to the contrary and subject to the 23 exceptions contained in Article VII, Section 9(A) of the Constitution of Louisiana, 24 the amount of five seven dollars and fifty cents from the fee for a motorcycle or motor scooter endorsement to a basic license, or the amount of two three dollars 25 from the fee if the motorcycle endorsement for any person is to a license that is valid 26 27 for only less than four six years shall be credited to the Bond Security and Redemption Fund. 6	§412.3. Office of Motor Vehicles Driver's License Escrow Fund; Office of
7	Motor Vehicles Handling Fee Escrow Fund
8	A. There is hereby created, as special funds in the state treasury, the
9	Office of Motor Vehicles Driver's License Escrow Fund, and the Office of Motor
10	Vehicles Handling Fee Escrow Fund.
11	B.(1) After compliance with the requirements of Article VII, Section
12	9(B) of the Constitution of Louisiana relative to the Bond Security and
13	<u>Redemption Fund, and after a sufficient amount is allocated from that fund to</u>
14	pay all of the obligations secured by the full faith and credit of the state which
15	become due and payable within any fiscal year, the treasurer shall pay an
16	<u>amount equal to one third of the monies received by the state treasury pursuant</u>
17	to the provisions of R.S. 32:412 into the Office of Motor Vehicles Driver's
18	License Escrow Fund. The monies in this fund shall be used solely as provided
19	in Subsection D of this Section. All unexpended and unencumbered monies in
20	this fund at the end of the fiscal year shall remain in the fund to cover under
21	collections in any subsequent fiscal year. The monies in the fund shall be
