KEYWORD AND SUMMARY AS RETURNED TO THE SENATE

CRIME/PUNISHMENT. Provides for offenses involving crimes against nature as they relate to incest. (8/1/14)

SUMMARY OF HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO THE SENATE BILL

- 1. Deletes provisions concerning the habitual offender law.
- 2. Adds requirement that the inclusion of the elements of the crime of incest and aggravated incest into provisions involving a crime against nature does not alleviate any requirement, obligation, or consequence imposed under the former incest provisions.

DIGEST OF THE SENATE BILL AS RETURNED TO THE SENATE

Martiny SB No. 229

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the inclusion during the 2014 Regular Session of elements of the crimes of incest and aggravated incest into the provisions for a crime against nature and repeal of the former statutory provisions for the crimes of incest and aggravated incest shall be the same as a conviction for these crimes as they existed under the former provisions.

Requires provides that this legislative action shall not be construed to alleviate any person convicted or adjudicated delinquent of incest (R.S. 14:78) or aggravated incest (R.S. 14:78.1) from any requirement, obligation, or consequence imposed by law resulting from that conviction or adjudication which includes any requirements regarding sex offender registration and notification, parental rights, probation, parole, sentencing, or any other requirement, obligation, or consequence imposed by law resulting from that conviction or adjudication.

Effective August 1, 2014.
