A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To commend the town of Farmerville upon winning the state "Cleanest City Contest" sponsored by the Louisiana Garden Club Federation in Category E.

WHEREAS, the Louisiana Garden Club Federation is affiliated with the National Garden Clubs, Inc., within the Deep South Region and is a non-profit organization bringing together the garden clubs of Louisiana through education, beautification, and conservation; and

WHEREAS, in 1958, the Louisiana Garden Club Federation began sponsoring a statewide "Cleanest City Contest"; and

WHEREAS, to date, Louisiana is the only member of the National Garden Clubs, Inc., to sponsor such a contest; and

WHEREAS, each year, competition has become stronger, and the cities and towns have achieved higher and higher standards of cleanliness; and

WHEREAS, the Louisiana Garden Club Federation points with pride to the many communities who have participated in the contest through the years and to the ever-increasing number of citizens who work year-round to keep their communities clean and beautiful; and

WHEREAS, the "Cleanest City in Louisiana" is chosen within categories based upon population, and the state winner in each category is chosen from the district winners in the category by a panel of state judges composed of three qualified Louisiana Garden Club Federation garden club members selected by the state contest chairman and approved by the Louisiana Garden Club Federation president; and
