Provides for the Louisiana Public School Choice Act. (gov sig)

The proposed legislation provides that a parent may enroll his child in the public school of his choice, without regards to residence, geographic boundaries, or attendance zones if the student would otherwise attend a school with a "D" or "F" performance letter grade and the student seeks to enroll in a school with a performance letter grade of "A", "B", or "C" for the most recent school year. The bill does not require a local school system to provide transportation to any student located outside the geographic boundaries of the school system in which he resides if it results in additional cost to the system. Provides for the student to be counted in the school system for the purpose of the Minimum Foundation Program (MFP) formula funding and any other state or federal funding for which the student may be eligible. The governing authority of each school shall work collaboratively and cooperatively and adopt a policy to govern transfers authorized by the legislation; any student transfer shall comply with the policy adopted by the governing authority of the school in which the student seeks to enroll. Effective upon governor's signature.

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## **EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION**

There is an indeterminable impact in state and local expenditures due to students from outside the geographic boundaries of the system choosing to attend schools within the system. The FY 14 MFP calculates an average local cost per student to be \$3,544, however, a local school district may spend more or less of that amount from local resources on any individual student. Local school systems would receive the total state per pupil funding from the MFP formula for each additional student that enters the school system to help cover the costs of educating each student. MFP expenditures could increase to provide full funding for a student entering a school system with a higher cost per pupil, or alternatively could decrease if the new school system is funded at a lower per pupil amount.

## **REVENUE EXPLANATION**

There could be an indeterminable increase in revenues for local schools districts to the extent the new school district in which the student enrolls chooses to assess a fee for the local share of the MFP per pupil amount. The bill requires local school districts to adopt policies relative to the enrollment of students from outside of the geographic boundaries of the district. Since the district receives no local revenue contributions from such a student; it may choose to assess a fee not to exceed the amount of the local share of the per pupil amount in the system in which the students seeks to enroll.
