Subject: Sex Offender Registry Technology Fund

SEX OFFENSE/REGISTRY EN -\$100,000 LF RV See Note

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Provides relative to the use of monies appropriated to the Sex Offender Registry Technology Fund

Present law provides that when the court places the defendant on supervised probation, it shall order as a condition of probation the payment of a monthly fee of \$11 which shall be credited to the Sex Offender Registry and Technology Fund.

Proposed law amends present law by changing the distribution as follows: (1) For FY 10-11 through FY 13-14 - \$150,000 shall be allocated to the office of the attorney general of which \$50,000 shall be allocated for personnel and other costs to assist and monitor sheriff participation in utilization of the computer system, and \$100,000 of which shall be allocated to the cost of maintenance of the computer system which shall interface with the computer systems of the sheriffs of the parishes for registration of sex offenders. (2) For FY 14-15 and thereafter - \$250,000 shall be allocated to the office of the attorney general of which \$150,000 shall be allocated for personnel and other costs to assist and monitor sheriff participation in utilization of the computer system and the administration of the sex offender and child predator registration and notification laws, and \$100,000 of which shall be allocated to the cost of maintenance of the computer system of the sheriffs of the parishes for registration of sex offenders.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

This bill reallocates the amount of revenues allocated to the four major entities receiving support from this fund. Currently, the Attorney General receives \$150,000 of which \$50,000 shall be allocated for personnel and other costs to assist and monitor sheriff participation in utilization of the computer system, and \$100,000 of which shall be allocated to the cost of maintenance of the computer system which shall interface with the computer systems of the sheriffs of the parishes for registration of sex offenders. The proposed legislation provides that for FY 15 and thereafter, the Attorney General's Office shall receive \$250,000, of which \$150,000 shall be allocated for personnel and other costs to assist and monitor sheriff participation in utilization of the computer system and the administration of the sex offender and child predator registration and notification laws, and \$100,000 of which shall be allocated to the cost of maintenance of the computer system of the sheriffs of the parishes for registration of sex child predators.

NOTE: According to the Attorney General, the increase in funding will be utilized for one additional attorney position and operating expenses to accomplish additional obligations related to HB 885. This legislation provides that the Attorney General will be responsible for the review and determination of a sex offender's end date of the period to register and notify.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

The proposed bill amends the distribution of the Sex Offender Registry Technology Fund and allows the Attorney General's Office to receive an additional \$100,000 allocation and a like amount will be reduced from the distribution to the sheriffs of each parish (depicted as a local revenue reduction in the table above). According to the latest adopted revenue forecast, the Sex Offender Registry Technology Fund is projected to collect approximately \$950,000 in total revenues of which under current law the local allocation would be \$636,250 as opposed to \$536,250.
