1	AN ACT
2	To enact R.S. 32:300.8, relative to the prohibition of the use of wireless telecommunications
3	devices in active school zones; to prohibit the use of wireless telecommunications
4	in school zones during posted hours; to provide for exceptions; to provide for
5	penalties; and to provide for related matters.
6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
7	Section 1. R.S. 32:300.8 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
8	§300.8. Use of wireless telecommunications devices in school zones prohibited;
9	exceptions
10	A. As used in this Section, the following terms shall have the meanings
11	ascribed to them in this Section, unless the context clearly indicates a different
12	meaning:
13	(1) "Wireless telecommunications device" means a cellular telephone, a text-
14	messaging device, a personal digital assistant, a stand-alone computer, or any other
15	substantially similar wireless device that is readily removable from the vehicle and
16	is used to write, send, or read text or data through manual input. A "wireless
17	telecommunications device" shall not include any device or component that is
18	permanently affixed to a motor vehicle. It does not include a hands-free wireless
19	telephone, an electronic communication device used hands-free, citizens band radios,
20	citizens band radio hybrids, commercial two-way radio communications devices,
21	two-way radio transmitters or receivers used by licensees of the Federal
22	Communication Commission in the Amateur Radio Service, or electronic
23	communication devices with a push-to-talk function.

1	(2) "Engage in a call" means talking or listening on a wireless
2	telecommunications device.
3	(3) "Write, send, or read a text-based communication" means using a
4	wireless telecommunications device to manually communicate with any person by
5	using a text-based communication including but not limited to a text message, instant
6	message, or electronic mail.
7	(4) "Access, read, or post to a social networking site" means using a wireless
8	telecommunications device to access, read, or post on such device to any web-based
9	service that allows individuals to construct a profile within a bounded system,
10	articulate a list of other users with whom they share a connection, and communicate
11	with other members of the site.
12	B. Except as provided in Subsection C of this Section, no person shall
13	operate any wireless telecommunications device while operating a motor vehicle
14	upon any public road or highway during the posted hours within a school zone on
15	such public road or highway. Operating a wireless telecommunications device shall
16	include:
17	(1) Engaging in a call.
18	(2) Writing, sending, or reading a text-based communication.
19	(3) Accessing, reading, or posting to a social networking site.
20	C. The provisions of Subsection B of this Section shall not apply to a person
21	who uses a wireless telecommunications device and does any of the following:
22	(1) Reports a traffic collision, medical emergency, or serious road hazard.
23	(2) Reports a situation in which the person believes his personal safety is in
24	jeopardy.
25	(3) Reports or averts the perpetration or potential perpetration of a criminal
26	act against the driver or another person.
27	(4) Operates a wireless telecommunications device while the motor vehicle
28	is lawfully parked.

	(5) Uses a wireless telecommunications device in an official capacity as an

HB NO. 370 **ENROLLED** 1 D.(1) Any violation of this Section shall constitute a moving violation. 2 (2)(a) The first violation of the provisions of this Section shall be punishable 3 by a fine of not more than one hundred seventy-five dollars. 4 (b) Each subsequent violation shall be punishable by a fine of not more than 5 five hundred dollars. 6 (c) If a person is involved in a collision at the time of the violation, then the 7 fine shall be equal to double the amount of the standard fine imposed in this 8 Subsection and the law enforcement officer investigating the collision shall indicate 9 on the written accident report that the person was using a wireless 10 telecommunications device at the time of the collision. 11 (3) It shall be an affirmative defense against an alleged violation for the 12 person to produce documentary or other evidence that the wireless 13 telecommunications device that is the basis of the alleged violation was used for emergency purposes as provided in Subsection C of this Section. 14 15 E. The provisions of this Section shall only apply within a school zone upon 16 a public road or highway during posted hours when signs are located in a visible 17 manner in each direction that indicate the use of a hand-held wireless 18 communications device is prohibited while operating a motor vehicle.
