

HOUSE BILL NO. 1280 (Substitute for House Bill No. 903 by Representative Simon)

BY REPRESENTATIVES SIMON, CONNICK, DOVE, GISCLAIR, ORTEGO, POPE, STOKES, AND PATRICK WILLIAMS

| 1 | AN ACT |
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| 2 | To amend and reenact R.S. 37:1271(B)(2) and to enact R.S. 37:1271(B)(3) through (5) and |
| 3 | Part LXXV of Chapter 5 of Title 40 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, to be |
| 4 | comprised of R.S. 40:1300.381 through 1300.384, relative to telehealth services; to |
| 5 | provide for definitions; to provide for the delivery of healthcare services through |
| 6 | telemedicine; to authorize state agencies and licensing boards and commissions to |
| 7 | promulgate rules governing healthcare services provided by telehealth; and to |
| 8 | provide for related matters. |
| 9 | Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: |
| 10 | Section 1. R.S. 37:1271(B)(2) is hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. |
| 11 | 37:1271(B)(3) through (5) are hereby enacted to read as follows: |
| 12 | \$1271. License to practice medicine or telemedicine required |

| 15 | * * * |
| 16 | (2) Any person authorized by the board to practice Except as provided in |
| 17 | R.S. 37:1276.1, all of the following shall apply to any physician practicing |
| 18 | telemedicine as defined in this Part: shall ensure that a licensed health care |
| 19 | professional who can adequately and accurately assist with any of the requirements |
| 20 | listed in R.S. 37:1276.1(B)(2) is in the examination room with the patient at the time |
| 21 | such patient is receiving telemedicine services. The board shall promulgate rules in |
| 22 | accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act to establish what type of health |
| 23 | care professional is necessary and appropriate under the circumstances. |

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| 1 | (a) The physician practicing telemedicine shall use the same standard of care |
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| 2 | as if the healthcare services were provided in person. |
| 3 | (b) The physician practicing telemedicine shall not be required to conduct |
| 4 | an in-person patient history or physical examination of the patient before engaging |
| 5 | in a telemedicine encounter if the physician satisfies all of the following conditions: |
| 6 | (i) Holds an unrestricted license to practice medicine in Louisiana. |
| 7 | (ii) Has access to the patient's medical records upon consent of the patient. |
| 8 | (iii) Maintains a physical practice location within the state of Louisiana or |
| 9 | executes an affirmation with the board that the physician has an arrangement with |
| 10 | another physician who maintains a physical practice location in Louisiana to provide |
| 11 | for referrals and follow-up care which may be necessary. |
| 12 | (3) Except as authorized by rule promulgated by the board, no physician |
| 13 | practicing telemedicine pursuant to this Subsection shall prescribe any controlled |
| 14 | dangerous substance prior to conducting an appropriate in-person patient history or |
| 15 | physical examination of the patient as determined by the board. |
| 16 | (4) A patient receiving telemedicine services may be in any location at the |
| 17 | time that the telemedicine services are rendered. A physician practicing |
| 18 | telemedicine may be in any location when providing telemedicine services to a |
| 19 | patient. |
| 20 | (5) A physician practicing telemedicine shall document the telemedicine |
| 21 | services rendered in the patient's medical records according to the same standard as |
| 22 | that required for nontelemedicine services. Medical records including but not |
| 23 | limited to video, audio, electronic, or other records generated as a result of providing |
| 24 | telemedicine services shall be considered as confidential and shall be subject to all |
| 25 | applicable state and federal laws and regulations relative to the privacy of health |
| 26 | information. |
| 27 | Section 2. Part LXXV of Chapter 5 of Title 40 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of |
| 28 | 1950, comprised of R.S. 40:1300.381 through 1300.384, is hereby enacted to read as |
| 29 | follows: |

| 1 | PART LXXV. LOUISIANA TELEHEALTH ACCESS ACT |
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| 2 | <u>§1300.381. Short title</u> |
| 3 | This Part shall be known and may be cited as the "Louisiana Telehealth |
| 4 | Access Act". |
| 5 | §1300.382. Legislative findings |
| 6 | The legislature hereby finds and declares the following: |
| 7 | (1) As an innovative form of health care, telehealth is extremely valuable |
| 8 | because it enhances access to care, particularly in rural locations and other medically |
| 9 | underserved areas; makes delivery of care more cost-effective; and distributes |
| 10 | limited provider resources more efficiently. |
| 11 | (2) Many patients with limited access to traditional health care can be |
| 12 | diagnosed and treated sooner through telehealth than they would be otherwise, |
| 13 | resulting in improved outcomes and less costly treatments due to early detection and |
| 14 | prevention. |
| 15 | (3) Telehealth services could potentially address a great unmet need for |
| 16 | health care by persons who have limited access to both traditional healthcare settings |
| 17 | and to telemedicine as currently defined in Louisiana law. |
| 18 | (4) If this state is to achieve much needed improvement in health outcomes, |
| 19 | a prudent and responsible policy for doing so would be to balance patient safety and |
| 20 | access to care through expanding access to telehealth services for the people of |
| 21 | Louisiana. |
| 22 | <u>§1300.383. Definitions</u> |
| 23 | (1) "Asynchronous store and forward transfer" means the transmission of a |
| 24 | patient's medical information from an originating site to the provider at the distant |
| 25 | site without the patient being present. |
| 26 | (2) "Distant site" means the site at which the healthcare provider delivering |
| 27 | the service is located at the time the service is provided via a telecommunications |
| 28 | system. |
| 29 | (3) "Healthcare provider" means a person, partnership, limited liability |
| 30 | partnership, limited liability company, corporation, facility, or institution licensed |

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| 1 | or certified by this state to provide health care or professional services as a physician |
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| 2 | assistant, hospital, nursing home, dentist, registered nurse, advanced practice |
| 3 | registered nurse, licensed practical nurse, certified nurse assistant, offshore health |
| 4 | service provider, ambulance service, licensed midwife, pharmacist, speech-language |
| 5 | pathologist, audiologist, optometrist, podiatrist, chiropractor, physical therapist, |
| 6 | occupational therapist, certified or licensed athletic trainer, psychologist, medical |
| 7 | psychologist, social worker, licensed professional counselor, licensed perfusionist, |
| 8 | licensed respiratory therapist, licensed radiologic technologist, or licensed clinical |
| 9 | laboratory scientist. |
| 10 | (4) "Originating site" means the location of the patient at the time the service |
| 11 | is furnished via a telecommunications system or when the asynchronous store and |
| 12 | forward transfer occurs. |
| 13 | (5) "Synchronous interaction" means communication through interactive |
| 14 | technology that enables a healthcare provider and a patient at two locations separated |
| 15 | by distance to interact via two-way video and audio transmissions simultaneously. |
| 16 | (6) "Telehealth" means a mode of delivering healthcare services that utilizes |
| 17 | information and communication technologies to enable the diagnosis, consultation, |
| 18 | treatment, education, care management, and self-management of patients at a |
| 19 | distance from healthcare providers. Telehealth allows services to be accessed when |
| 20 | providers are in a distant site and patients are in the originating site. Telehealth |
| 21 | facilitates patient self-management and caregiver support for patients and includes |
| 22 | synchronous interactions and asynchronous store and forward transfers. |
| 23 | <u>§1300.384.</u> Telehealth; rulemaking required |
| 24 | A. Each state agency or professional or occupational licensing board or |
| 25 | commission that regulates the practice of a healthcare provider, as defined in this |
| 26 | Part, may promulgate, in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act, any |
| 27 | rules necessary to provide for, promote, and regulate the use of telehealth in the |
| 28 | delivery of healthcare services within the scope of practice regulated by the licensing |
| 29 | entity. |
| 30 | B. The rules shall, at a minimum, provide for all of the following: |

| 1 | (1) Application of all laws regarding the confidentiality of healthcare |
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| 2 | information and the patient's rights to the patient's medical information created |
| 3 | during telehealth interactions. |
| 4 | (2) Application of the same standard of care by a healthcare provider as if |
| 5 | the healthcare services were provided in person. |
| 6 | (3)(a) Licensing or registration of out-of-state healthcare providers who seek |
| 7 | to furnish healthcare services via telehealth to persons at originating sites in |
| 8 | Louisiana. The rules shall ensure that any such healthcare provider possesses, at a |
| 9 | minimum, an unrestricted and unencumbered license in good standing to perform the |
| 10 | healthcare service in the state in which the healthcare provider is located, and that |
| 11 | the license is comparable to its corresponding license in Louisiana as determined by |
| 12 | the respective Louisiana licensing agency, board, or commission. |
| 13 | (b) Each state agency and professional or occupational licensing board or |
| 14 | commission is authorized to provide by rule for a reasonable fee for the license or |
| 15 | registration provided for in this Subsection. |
| 16 | (4) Exemption from the telehealth license or registration required by this |
| 17 | Subsection for the consultation of a healthcare professional licensed by this state |
| 18 | with an out-of-state peer professional. |
| 19 | C. Nothing in this Part shall be construed to authorize a state agency or |
| 20 | professional or occupational licensing board or commission to expand, diminish, or |
| 21 | alter the scope of practice of any healthcare provider. |
