2	To amend and reenact R.S. 33:9091.14(D), (F)(1) and (3)(c), relative to the Mid-City
3	Security District; to provide for governance; to provide for a flat fee per parcel of
4	land; to provide for election dates; to provide for an effective date; and to provide for
5	related matters.
6	Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. R.S. 33:9091.14(D), (F)(1) and (3)(c) are hereby amended and reenacted
9	to read as follows:
10	§9091.14. Mid-City Security District

12	D. Governance. (1) The district shall be governed by a five-member board
13	of commissioners, referred to in this Section as the "board". The board shall be
14	composed as follows:
15	(a) The Mid-City Neighborhood Organization shall appoint two four
16	members, one of whom shall be from the City Park Triangle.
17	(b) The Parkview Neighborhood Association shall appoint one member.
18	(c) The two members of the governing authority of the city of New Orleans
19	who are elected from Council District A and Council District B shall each appoint
20	one member.
21	(2) All members appointed pursuant to Paragraph (1) of this Subsection shall
22	be qualified voters and residents of the district.
23	(3) Board members appointed pursuant to Paragraph (1) of this Subsection

1	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
2	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
3	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
4	vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
5	effective on the day following such approval.
