15	compensation in addition to the salary as provided herein.

Abstract: Authorizes an increase in court reporter fees for the 27th Judicial District Court upon review and recommendation of the Judicial Council.

<u>Present law</u> authorizes the court reporters in the 27th JDC to charge and collect as compensation in addition to salary, a fee of \$2.50 per page for the original and 50¢ per page for copies reported and transcribed in all civil and criminal cases.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> except that it changes the collected fees <u>from</u> \$2.50 to \$3.50.

<u>Present law</u> requires court reporters to be paid a fee of \$2.25 per 31-line page transcript and 25ϕ per page for each copy, as funds become available, to be paid from the criminal indigent transcript fund by the court.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> except that it changes the collected fees $\underline{\text{from}}$ \$2.25 $\underline{\text{to}}$ \$3.50.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for the increase in court costs to become effective if and when the Judicial Council reviews such request and makes a recommendation to the legislature in its 2016 report.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Judiciary</u> to the <u>original</u> bill:

1. Add an effective date for the increase in court costs to become effective if and when the Judicial Council reviews such request and makes a recommendation to the legislature in its 2016 report.
