SENATE BILL NO. 218

BY SENATOR MURRAY

FUNDS/FUNDING. Establishes a program to attract major events to the state and dedicates funds therefor. (7/1/15)

1	AN ACT
2	To enact Subpart G-1 of Part II-A of Chapter 1 of Subtitle I of Title 39 of the Louisiana
3	Revised Statutes of 1950, to be comprised of R.S. 39:100.5 through 100.8, relative
4	to dedication of funds; to dedicate money to fund incentives for attracting specified
5	major events; to establish the Major Events Incentive Program Fund as a special fund
6	in the state treasury; to provide for the deposit of monies into and use of such monies
7	in the fund; to provide for the appropriation of monies from the fund; to establish a
8	program for such incentives; to provide for qualifications for payments from the
9	dedicated funds; to provide for determination of the incentive payments to be made
10	from such dedicated funds; to provide for an effective date; and to provide for related
11	matters.
12	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
13	Section 1. Subpart G-1 of Part II-A of Chapter 1 of Subtitle I of Title 39 of the
14	Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, comprised of R.S. 39:100.5 through 100.8, is hereby
15	enacted to read as follows:
16	SUBPART G-1. MAJOR EVENTS INCENTIVE PROGRAM FUND
17	§100.5. Definitions

1	As used in this Subpart:
2	(1) "Endorsing municipality" means either of the following:
3	(a) A municipality that contains a site selected by a site selection
4	organization for a qualified event and is a party to an event support contract.
5	(b) A municipality that does not contain a site selected by a site selection
6	organization for a qualified event, but is included in the market area for the
7	event as designated by the secretary and is a party to an event support contract.
8	(2) "Endorsing parish" means either of the following:
9	(a) A parish that contains a site selected by a site selection organization
10	for a qualified event and is a party to an event support contract.
11	(b) A parish that does not contain a site selected by a site selection
12	organization for a qualified event, but is included in the market area for the
13	event as designated by the secretary and is a party to an event support contract.
14	(3) "Event support contract" or "event contract" means a joint
15	undertaking, joint agreement, or a similar contract executed by a local
16	organizing committee, an endorsing municipality, or an endorsing parish and
17	a site selection organization.
18	(4) "Local organizing committee" means an organization created as the
19	official host entity sanctioned by an endorsing municipality or parish for a
20	specified major event.
21	(5) "Qualified event" means a National Football League Super Bowl, a
22	National Collegiate Athletic Association Final Four tournament game, the
23	National Basketball Association All-Star Game, the X Games, a National
24	Collegiate Athletic Association Division I Football Bowl Subdivision postseason
25	playoff or championship game, the World Games, a national collegiate
26	championship of an amateur sport sanctioned by the national governing body
27	of the sport that is recognized by the United States Olympic Committee, an
28	Olympic activity including a Junior or Senior activity, training program, or
29	feeder program sanctioned by the United States Olympic Committee's

1	Community Olympic Development Program, a mixed martial arts
2	championship, the Breeders' Cup World Championships, a Bass Masters
3	Classic, a National Motorsports race, the Red Bull Series, a National Collegiate
4	Athletic Association football kickoff game, a national championship or Olympic
5	trials of an amateur or professional sport sanctioned by the national governing
6	body of the sport, a national military event, or a national political convention
7	of the Republican National Committee or of the Democratic National
8	Committee. The term includes any activities related to or associated with a
9	qualified event.
10	(6) "Secretary" means the secretary of the Department of Economic
11	Development.
12	(7) "Site selection organization" means any of the following:
13	(a) The National Football League, the National Collegiate Athletic
14	Association, the National Basketball Association, the International World
15	Games Association, or the United States Olympic Committee.
16	(b) The national governing body of a sport that is recognized by the
17	United States Olympic Committee.
18	(c) The National Thoroughbred Racing Association.
19	(d) The Republican National Committee or Democratic National
20	Committee.
21	(e) The national governing body of the site selection organizations for
22	qualified events not listed in Subparagraphs (7)(a) through (d) of this Section.
23	§100.6. Major Events Incentive Program Fund
24	A. There is hereby established in the state treasury a special fund to be
25	known as the "Major Events Incentive Program Fund", hereafter in this
26	Chapter, the "fund".
27	<b>B.</b> Beginning with the 2015-2016 Fiscal Year and for each fiscal year
28	thereafter, and after allocation of money to the Bond Security and Redemption
29	Fund as provided in Article VII, Section 9(B) of the Constitution of Louisiana,

1	the treasurer shall deposit in and credit to the fund on a monthly basis an
2	amount equal to the sum of the incremental increase in state tax receipts
3	generated by the occurrence of all qualified as provided in R.S. 39:100.7.
4	<b><u>C.</u></b> Monies in the fund shall be invested in the same manner as the state
5	general fund monies. Interest earned on the investment of monies in the fund,
6	after being credited to the Bond Security and Redemption Fund pursuant to
7	Article VII, Section 9(B) of the Constitution of Louisiana, shall be credited to
8	the fund. All unexpended and unencumbered monies and earnings remaining
9	in the fund at the end of the fiscal year shall remain in the fund.
10	<b>D.</b> Subject to legislative appropriation and the approval of the Joint
11	Legislative Committee on the Budget, the treasurer shall disburse monies in the
12	fund to each eligible entity at times and in amounts as determined by the
13	secretary pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter.
14	<u>§100.7. Incentives</u>
15	A. Subject to legislative appropriation and the approval of the Joint
16	Legislative Committee on the Budget, the secretary of the Department of
17	<b>Economic Development is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with a local</b>
18	organizing committee, endorsing parish, or endorsing municipality to recruit,
19	solicit, or acquire for Louisiana any qualified event that will have a significant
20	positive impact on economic development in the state. The contract shall
21	provide for a financial commitment to the local organizing committee,
22	endorsing parish, or endorsing municipality which shall be subject to legislative
23	appropriation and shall be paid with funds dedicated for that purpose pursuant
24	to R.S. 39:100.6.
25	<b>B.</b> Certification of sales. The secretary shall determine the amount of
26	the incentive payment to be made pursuant to the contract and shall notify the
27	treasurer of his determination. Payments shall be based upon the amount of
28	incremental increase in certain state tax receipts generated within the
29	designated area by the occurrence of the qualified event during a specified

1	period, as determined by the secretary. Such state tax receipts shall be limited
2	to excise tax and sales and use taxes, excluding state hotel and motel occupancy
3	taxes. The amount of the incremental increase shall not include local tax
4	receipts. Such payment shall not exceed seventy percent of the total tax receipts
5	projected to be collected.
6	C. Incentive payment. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the
7	contrary, the treasurer shall make the payment authorized pursuant to
8	provisions of this Section from the monies in the fund created by R.S. 39:100.6.
9	§100.8. Requirements for eligibility
10	An event not included in the definition of qualified event is ineligible for
11	funding under this Chapter. A qualified event may receive funding under this
12	Chapter only if all of the following conditions are met:
13	(1) After considering through a highly competitive selection process one
14	or more sites that are not located in this state, a site selection organization
15	selects a site located in this state for an event to be held once, or for an event
16	scheduled to be held annually for a period of years under an event contract.
17	(2) A site selection organization selects a site in this state as the sole site
18	for the event.
19	(3) The event is held not more frequently than annually.
20	Section 2. This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2015.

<u>Proposed law</u> establishes the Major Events Incentive Program authorizing the secretary of the Dept. of Economic Development (DED) to enter into a contract with a local organizing committee, endorsing parish, or endorsing municipality to recruit, solicit, or acquire for Louisiana major specified events that have a significant positive economic development impact on the state. Subject to legislative appropriation and the approval of the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget, the contract shall provide for financial commitment to the local organizing committee, endorsing parish, or endorsing municipality which shall be paid with funds dedicated for such purposes.

Proposed law creates a fund in the treasury for deposit of the incremental increase in certain

Page 5 of 7 Coding: Words which are struck through are deletions from existing law; words in **boldface type and underscored** are additions. state taxes generated by the occurrence of the qualified event.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes the DED secretary to determine the amount of the incentive to be paid pursuant to the contract, based upon the amount of incremental increase in tax receipts within the designated area attributable to the qualified event during a specified period as determined by the secretary. Such state tax receipts shall be limited to excise tax and sales and use tax, excluding state hotel and motel occupancy taxes. The amount of the increment increase shall not include local tax receipts. Such rebate shall not exceed 70% of the incremental increase.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the treasurer to make the incentive payment from the fund as certified by the DED secretary, subject to legislative appropriation and the approval of the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget.

Proposed law defines qualified events and includes, among others:

- (1) The NFL Super Bowl.
- (2) The NCAA Final Four.
- (3) The NBA All-Star Game.
- (4) The X Games.
- (5) An NCAA Division I Football Bowl Subdivision postseason playoff or championship game.
- (6) The World Games.
- (7) A national collegiate championship of an amateur sport recognized by the United States Olympic Committee (USOC).
- (8) An Olympic activity, including a Junior or Senior activity, training program, or feeder program sanctioned by the USOC.
- (9) A mixed martial arts championship.
- (10) The Breeders' Cup World Championships.
- (11) A Bass Masters Classic.
- (12) A National Motorsports race.
- (13) A national political convention of the Republican National Committee or the Democratic National Committee.

<u>Proposed law</u> also requires the event to be held no more often than annually and to be one for which one or more sites not located in the state are considered. Further requires that a site selection organization selects a site in this state as the sole site for the event.

Effective July 1, 2015.

#### Summary of Amendments Adopted by Senate

## Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Finance to the original <u>bill</u>

- 1. Moves proposed legislation from Title 47 to Title 39.
- 2. Provides that disbursement of monies from the fund are subject to legislative appropriation.
- 3. Provides for approval by the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget.
- 4. Provides that the amount of the incremental increase shall be determined by the secretary of the Department of Economic Development.
- 5. Provides that the amount of the incremental increase shall be based upon state excise taxes and state sales and use taxes, excluding state hotel and motel occupancy taxes and does not include any local taxes.
- 6. Provides that the state shall be the sole site for the event.
