Abstract: Authorizes the attorney general and certain investigators to use electronic surveillance equipment pursuant to a court order.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the use of electronic surveillance equipment pursuant to a court order.

<u>Present law</u> limits the use of such equipment to "law enforcement or investigative officers" and defines those as:

- (1) Any commissioned officer of the office of state police.
- (2) Any full-time commissioned city police officer of a municipality of this state.
- (3) Any sheriff or deputy sheriff of a parish of this state.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds the attorney general or an attorney general's investigator to the list of law enforcement officers who can obtain a court order authorizing the use of electronic surveillance equipment.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Administration of Criminal</u> <u>Justice</u> to the <u>original</u> bill:

1. Remove assistant attorney generals from those investigative or law enforcement officers who can apply for a court order to use of a pen register or trap and trace device.
