SCHOOLS/DISTRICTS: Creates a task force to study the feasibility of establishing independent school districts in Louisiana

1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION		
2	To create a task force to study the feasibility of establishing independent school districts for		
3	elementary and secondary education in Louisiana, to submit a preliminary written		
4	report on the status of the study proceedings by not later than March 1, 2016, and to		
5	submit a final written report of study findings, conclusions, and recommendations		
6	to the House Committee on Education and the Senate Committee on Education not		
7	later than sixty days prior to the beginning of the 2017 Regular Session of the		
8	Legislature of Louisiana.		
9	WHEREAS, the Constitution of Louisiana provides that it is the goal of the public		
10	educational system "to provide learning environments and experiences, at all stages of		
11	human development, that are humane, just, and designed to promote excellence in order that		
12	every individual may be afforded an equal opportunity to develop to his full potential"; and		
13	WHEREAS, in keeping with this goal, the state's public educational system provides		
14	learning environments and experiences to the children of this state through public elementary		
15	and secondary schools administered by the various parishes, cities, and other local public		
16	school districts throughout the state; and		
17	WHEREAS, Louisiana's public educational system does not include independent		
18	school districts; and		
19	WHEREAS, an independent school district is a type of school district used in some		
20	states for elementary and secondary education which operates as an entity that is		
21	independent and separate from any municipality, county, or state; and

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WHEREAS, independent school districts have the authority to establish and manage 2 diverse educational opportunities within their set geographical boundaries and may include 3 such benefits as increased school choice for parents and students and increased school 4 efficiency and teacher pay through healthy competition among schools; and

5 WHEREAS, other advantages of independent school districts may include better 6 serving student needs and priorities and positive impacts on the local economy and 7 taxpayers; and

8 WHEREAS, in order to fulfill the state's constitutional duty of affording every 9 student an equal opportunity to develop to his full potential, it is imperative that a balanced 10 group of experts thoroughly study the feasibility of establishing independent school districts 11 for elementary and secondary education in Louisiana.

12 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby 13 create a task force to study the feasibility of establishing independent school districts for 14 elementary and secondary education in Louisiana, to submit a preliminary written report on 15 the status of the study proceedings by not later than March 1, 2016, and to submit a final 16 written report of study findings, conclusions, and recommendations to the House Committee 17 on Education and the Senate Committee on Education not later than sixty days prior to the 18 beginning of the 2017 Regular Session of the Legislature of Louisiana.

- 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force shall be composed of the 20 following members:
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(1) The state superintendent of education or his designee.

22 (2) The president of the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education or his 23 designee.

24 (3) The chairman of the House Committee on Education or his designee.

- 25 (4) The chairman of the Senate Committee on Education or his designee.
- 26 (5) A member of the Louisiana House of Representatives, selected by the speaker 27 of the House.
- 28 (6) A member of the Louisiana Senate, selected by the president of the Senate.
- 29 (7) A representative from each of the following organizations selected by the 30 presiding officer of the organization:

12	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in conducting the study the task force shall		
13	consider all of the following:		
14	(1) The basic process for establishing independent school districts.		
15	(2) The financial, economical, demographic, legal, and geographic implications and		
16	effects of the establishment of independent school districts including but not limited to any		
17	projected sales tax and property tax revenue streams for such districts and how state funding		
18	will be provided to the districts.		
19	(3) The enrollment capacity of such newly created districts relative to the demand		
20	for public school services.		
21	(4) The degree to which the existing capital infrastructures can accommodate such		
22	enrollment and the extent to which future capital expansion may be required.		
23	(5) Compliance with all federal desegregation orders as may be applicable.		
24	(6) Any other information that the task force determines necessary or proper to fully		
25	complete the study.		
26	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the state superintendent of education or his		
27	designee shall be responsible for designating staff to assist the task force in performing its		
28	duties and, by September 1, 2015, convening the task force for its first meeting, at which the		
29	task force shall adopt rules of procedure, a work schedule, and any additional measures that		
30	it deems necessary for the timely performance of its duties.		

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that members of the task force shall serve without

- 2 compensation.
- 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the
- 4 president of the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education and to the state
- 5 superintendent of education who shall be responsible for transmitting a copy to each of the
- 6 organizations from which the members of the task force are being selected or designated.
