The Senate Commerce Committee amendment creates the Lifeline Assistance Program Compliance statute in which state agencies may execute a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with a telephone service provider granting the provider access to the agency's databases, unless prohibited by federal law or regulation. Based on committee testimony, the legislation will serve as a way for telephone service providers to determine if a participate in the Lifeline Assistance Program meets the criteria for eligibility. The eligibility will be determined if a participant receives any of the following public assistance programs: Medicaid, Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program, Supplement Security Income, National School Lunch, Temporary Assistance for Needy Families, or Federal Public Housing.
