SUMMARY OF HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO THE SENATE BILL

- 1. Makes technical changes.
- 2. Specifies that expenditures excluded from production expenditures may be allocated only on a pro rata basis and allocation of fees as a relative percentage.

<u>Present law</u> grants a motion picture investor tax credit as a percentage of the "base investment" made and used for "production expenditures" in the state for a "state-certified production". The term "production expenditures" is defined in <u>present law</u>.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the term "expenditure" does not include expenditures for marketing and distribution, non-production related overhead, amounts reimbursed by the state or other governmental entity, costs related to the transfer of tax credits, amounts paid as a result of participation in profits from the exploration of the production, the application fee, or state or local taxes.

<u>Proposed law</u> applies to productions with applications received by the office of entertainment industrial development on and after July 1, 2016.

<u>Proposed law</u> also provides that the term "expenditures" does not include expenditures for airfare or expenditures for bond fees, insurance premiums, finance fees, loan interest fees, or payments of a similar nature paid to investors in the production unless made to certain insurance producers, financial institutions, or a business and industrial development company regulated by the office of financial institutions.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for allocation of expenditures on a pro rata basis and allocation of fees as a percentage of production activity in and out of state.

Effective January 1, 2016.
