VETERANS: Amends eligibility requirements to participate in the Veterans Court program

Synopsis of Senate Amendments

- 1. Adds a provision that excludes a defendant from participating in the program if the crime before the court is any sex offense that requires registration.
- 2. Removes requirement for the consent of the victim prior to determination of eligibility if the crime before the court is a crime of violence.

Digest of Bill as Finally Passed by Senate

<u>Present law</u> excludes a defendant from participating in the Veterans Court program if the defendant's crime being considered before the court is a crime of violence as defined in <u>present law</u> or if the defendant has a prior felony offense or other pending criminal proceedings alleging commission of a crime of violence.

<u>Proposed law</u> expands participation in the Veterans Court program by <u>excluding</u> only those defendants:

- (1) Who have a prior felony conviction for homicide.
- (2) Whose crime before the court is: (a) an offense defined as a homicide; (b) a sex offense requiring registration; (c) a crime of violence, unless the entire sentence is deferred or suspended pursuant to law; or (d) a second or subsequent offense for domestic abuse battery.

<u>Proposed law</u> also excludes defendants who are before the court on a first offense for domestic abuse battery, unless the defendant has complied with the domestic abuse battery sentencing requirements in <u>present law</u>.
