<u>Existing law</u> provides for the Uniform Unclaimed Property Act which requires a holder of abandoned property to deliver the abandoned property to the state treasurer under certain circumstances.

<u>Existing law</u> provides that property is presumed abandoned if it is unclaimed by the apparent owner for a certain period of time which depends on the type of the particular property.

<u>Existing law</u> provides a listing of criteria indicating an owner's interest in property, including the presentment of a check or other instrument of payment of a dividend, an owner-directed activity in the account in which the property is held, and the making of a deposit to or withdrawal from a bank account.

<u>New law</u> specifies that the criteria related to bank account withdrawals and deposits includes any one-time or recurring clearing house transaction, or any owner-directed electronic transaction.

<u>New law</u> adds to the criteria indicating an owner's interest in property, the accessing of a deposit account by the owner through the website or other restricted electronic access point of the banking or financial organization.

Effective upon signature of governor (June 29, 2015).
