Abstract: Decreases penalties for crimes involving the possession of drug paraphernalia to make those penalties consistent with penalties for possession of marijuana.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the penalties for violations of law regarding the possession, sale, and use of drug paraphernalia.

<u>Present law</u> (which originated as Act No. 295 of the 2015 Regular Session) reduced penalties for the possession of marijuana.

<u>Proposed law</u> reduces the penalties for drug paraphernalia offenses to mirror those of possession of marijuana.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides penalties for a first conviction of a fine of not more than \$300, imprisonment for not more than 15 days, or both. For a second conviction - a fine of not more than \$1,000, imprisonment for not more than six months, or both. For a third or subsequent conviction - a fine of not more than \$2,500, imprisonment for not more than two years, or both.
