STUDENT/LOANS-SCHOLARSHP: Creates a new Taylor Opportunity Program for Students (TOPS) award, the TOPS-Tech Transfer Award


#### Abstract

AN ACT

To amend and reenact R.S. 17:5002(A), (D), (E), and (G)(1), 5024(A)(1)(introductory paragraph) and (a) and (B)(1)(introductory paragraph) and (a), 5025(introductory paragraph), $5027(\mathrm{~A})(1)$ and $(\mathrm{C})($ introductory paragraph $), 5029(\mathrm{C})$ (introductory paragraph), and 5041 (introductory paragraph), (3), (4), and (5), to enact R.S. 17:5024(A)(1)(e) and (B)(1)(e), 5024.1, 5041(6), and 5041.1, and to repeal R.S. $17: 5024(\mathrm{~A})(2)$ and $(3)(\mathrm{b}),(\mathrm{B})(2)$, and $(\mathrm{C})$, relative to the Taylor Opportunity Program for Students; to revise certain academic criteria for initial and continuing eligibility for certain program awards; to provide for the establishment of a new program award and for amounts, duration, and eligibility requirements relative to such award; and to provide for related matters.


Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
Section 1. R.S. 17:5002(A), (D), (E), and (G)(1), 5024(A)(1)(introductory paragraph) and (a) and (B)(1)(introductory paragraph) and (a), 5025(introductory paragraph $), 5027(\mathrm{~A})(1)$ and $(\mathrm{C})($ introductory paragraph $), 5029(\mathrm{C})$ (introductory paragraph), and 5041 (introductory paragraph), (3), (4), and (5) are hereby amended and reenacted and

R.S. 17:5024(A)(1)(e) and (B)(1)(e), 5024.1, 5041(6) and 5041.1 are hereby enacted to read as follows:
§5002. Awards and amounts
A. A student shall be eligible for an Opportunity, Performance, Honors, or TOPS-Tech, or TOPS-Tech Transfer Award based on his academic achievement.
D.(1)(a) Except as otherwise provided in this Subsection Subparagraph (b) of this Paragraph, a student who is eligible for a TOPS-Tech Award pursuant to this Chapter and who is enrolled:
(a)(i) In an eligible public college or university that does not offer an academic undergraduate degree at the baccalaureate level in those associate's degree or other shorter-term training and education programs that are aligned to state workforce priorities as determined by the Board of Regents and the Louisiana Workforce Investment Council shall be awarded by the state an amount determined by the administering agency to equal the tuition charged by the college or university. If the Board of Regents and the Louisiana Workforce Investment Council determine that a program is no longer aligned with those priorities, an otherwise eligible student who had previously received an award and enrolled in that program may continue to use the award.
(b)(ii) In an eligible college or university other than as provided for in Item (i) of this Subparagraph (a) of this Paragraph in those associate's degree or other shorter-term training education programs that are aligned to state workforce priorities as determined by the Board of Regents and the Louisiana Workforce Investment Council shall be awarded by the state an amount determined by the administering agency to equal the weighted average of amounts paid to students attending an eligible public college or university that does not offer an academic undergraduate degree at the baccalaureate level. If the Board of Regents and the Louisiana Workforce Investment Council determine that a program is no longer
aligned with those priorities, an otherwise eligible student who had previously received an award and enrolled in that program may continue to use the award.
(2)(b) A student who graduated prior to the 2016-2017 school year, who is eligible for a TOPS-Tech Award pursuant to this Chapter, and who is enrolled:
(a)(i) In an eligible college or university that does not offer an academic undergraduate degree at the baccalaureate level shall be awarded by the state an amount determined by the administering agency to equal the tuition charged by the college or university.
(b)(ii) In an eligible college or university other than as provided for in Item (i) of this Subparagraph (a) of this Paragraph shall be awarded by the state an amount determined by the administering agency to equal the weighted average of amounts paid to students attending an eligible public college or university that does not offer an academic undergraduate degree at the baccalaureate level.
(2) A student who is eligible for a TOPS-Tech Transfer Award pursuant to this Chapter and has:
(a) Enrolled in an eligible college or university at which an eligible student may use a TOPS-Tech Award as provided in Subparagraph (1)(a) of this Subsection shall be awarded by the state an amount at the TOPS-Tech Award level.
(b) Transferred to and enrolled in an eligible college or university at which an eligible student may use an Opportunity Award as provided in Paragraphs (B)(1), (2), and (4) of this Section shall be awarded by the state an amount at the Opportunity Award level.
E.(1) No student shall be eligible for tuition payment pursuant to this Section for the Opportunity Award, the Performance Award, or the Honors Award for more than eight semesters or an equivalent number of units in an eligible institution which operates on a schedule based on units other than semesters, unless an extension is granted by the administering ageney in aceordance with its rules.
(2)(a) No student shall be eligible for tuition payment pursuant to this Section for the TOPS-Tech Transfer Award pursuant to Subparagraph (D)(2)(a) of this Section for more than two years.
(b) No student shall be eligible for tuition payment pursuant to Subparagraph (D)(2)(b) of this Section for more than four semesters or an equivalent number of units in an eligible institution which operates on a schedule based on units other than semesters.
(2)(3) No student shall be eligible for tuition payment pursuant to this Section for the TOPS-Tech Award for more than two years untess an extension is granted by the administering ageney in aceordance with its rules.
(4) The administering agency may grant extensions to the time limitations provided by this Subsection in accordance with rules it adopts.
(3)(a) (5)(a) Any student receiving an a TOPS-Tech Transfer, Opportunity, Performance, or Honors Award who successfully completes an academic undergraduate degree in less than the eight semesters or its equivalent of award benefits provided by this Subsection shall be eligible to continue to receive all applicable award benefits, in accordance with the limitations as specified in Subparagraph (b) of this Paragraph, for any remaining semester or semesters or the equivalent thereof of eligibility not used to obtain the undergraduate degree if the student pursues a postgraduate academic degree at an eligible institution and the student continues to meet all academic and other requirements provided by this Section and by rule of the administering agency for continued receipt of the award as an undergraduate except as such requirements, including requirements provided by this Section for undergraduate students, may be modified by the administering agency as necessary to apply such requirements to postgraduate study.
(b) In developing rules to implement this Paragraph, the administering agency shall establish reasonable time lines and deadlines for receipt of any information required to implement this Paragraph both for current and subsequent students receiving Opportunity, Performanee, or Honors such awards and for any
student previously receiving such an award who successfully completed an academic undergraduate degree in less than eight semesters. Such rules shall also provide for appropriate notice to all such students of the time lines, deadlines, and rules governing implementation of this Paragraph.
(c) The amount of the award benefits as provided for in Subparagraph (a) of this Paragraph shall not exceed the amounts determined by the administering agency to equal the tuition charged for the postgraduate study or for undergraduate full-time enrollment charged by the highest cost public college university in the state, whichever amount is less.
G. In lieu of the payment of tuition as provided in this Section, any student participating in the program provided by R.S. 29:36.1 for persons serving in the Louisiana National Guard shall receive the tuition exemption as provided therein. However, in addition to any other payments provided for by R.S. 29:36.1:
(1) For any student who is participating in the tuition exemption program provided by R.S. 29:36.1 and who also meets the qualifications provided in this Section for receipt of an Opportunity Award ${ }_{2}$ or a TOPS-Tech Award, or a TOPSTech Transfer Award, the state shall pay on behalf of such student a sum of three hundred dollars per semester or six hundred dollars per academic year to be applied toward the cost of books and other instructional materials.
§5024. Academic requirements
A.(1) Exeept as otherwise provided by this Subsection, students Students shall meet the following minimum grade point average requirements, calculated on a 4.00 scale using only the grades obtained by the student in completing the core curriculum requirements established by this Chapter, for the respective awards:
(a) For an Opportunity Award, a minimum cumulative grade point average of $2.50 \underline{3.00}$.

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(e) For a TOPS-Tech Transfer Award, a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50 .
B.(1) Exeeptas otherwise providedby this Subseetion, a $\underline{\text { A }}$ student shall earn the following minimum test scores for the respective awards:
(a) For an Opportunity Award, a composite score on the 1990 version of the ACT whieh is at least equal to or higher than the state's average composite seore, rounded to the nearest whole number, reported for the prior year but never less than twenty of at least twenty-one or an equivalent concordant value on an enhanced or revised version of such test or on the SAT.
(e) For a TOPS-Tech Transfer Award, a composite score on the 1990 version of the ACT which is at least equal to or higher than the state's average composite score, rounded to the nearest whole number, reported for the prior year but never less than twenty or an equivalent concordant value on an enhanced or revised version of such test or on the SAT. §5024.1 Academic requirements; exceptions
A. Notwithstanding R.S. 17:5024(A):
(1) For an Opportunity Award, a student graduating from high school prior to the 2019-2020 school year shall have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50 , calculated on a 4.00 scale using only the grades obtained by the student in completing the core curriculum requirements established by this Chapter.
(2) For a student who graduated prior to the 2002-2003 school year, the $\underline{\text { minimum cumulative grade point average shall be calculated by using the grades }}$ obtained by the student in completing all classes taken.
(3) For a student who graduated prior to the 2007-2008 school year, the minimum cumulative high school grade point average necessary for such students to be eligible for an initial Performance Award or Honors Award shall be 3.50 on a 4.00 scale.
(4) The provisions of R.S. 17:5024(A)(3)(a) do not apply to students who graduated prior to the 2017-2018 school year.
B. Notwithstanding R.S. 17:5024(B):
(1) For an Opportunity Award, a student graduating from high school prior to the 2019-2020 school year shall earn a composite score on the 1990 version of the ACT which is at least equal to or higher than the state's average composite score, rounded to the nearest whole number, reported for the prior year but never less than twenty or an equivalent concordant value on an enhanced or revised version of such test or on the SAT.
(2) For a student who graduated prior to the 2010-2011 school year, the ACT WorkKeys system is not an alternative assessment for establishing eligibility for a TOPS-Tech Award.
(3) For a student who graduated prior to the 2000-2001 school year, the minimum ACT score for a TOPS-Tech Award is nineteen.
C. Notwithstanding R.S. 17:5024(A) and (B), a student who graduated after the 2002-2003 school year but prior to the 2006-2007 school year is eligible to receive a Performance Award pursuant to this Chapter if he meets the other requirements of this Chapter and each of the following conditions is met:
(1) The student achieved a minimum cumulative high school grade point average of 3.00 on a 4.00 scale when calculated in accordance with applicable rules adopted by the administering agency and such calculation is based on ten or more of the grades being grades for completion of honors curriculum courses, gifted curriculum courses, or advanced placement courses, or any combination of such courses, and the high school awards grades for such courses on a 4.00 scale or higher.
(2) The student has a composite score on the 1990 version of the ACT of twenty-four or higher or an equivalent concordant value on any enhanced or revised version of such test or on the SAT.
§5025. High school core curriculum requirements; Opportunity, Performance, Honors and TOPS-Tech Transfer Awards

To be eligible for an Opportunity, Performance, or Honors Award pursuant to this Chapter, a student who graduates during or after the 2017-2018 school year shall have successfully completed a core curriculum which consists of nineteen units of high school course work, and to be eligible for a TOPS-Tech Transfer Award pursuant to this Chapter, a student who graduates during or after the 2019-2020 school year shall have successfully completed the same core curriculum, as follows:
§5027. Postsecondary institution enrollment
A.(1)(a) Except as otherwise provided by this Section, to be eligible for an award pursuant to this Chapter, the student shall enroll in an eligible college or university as a first-time freshman not later than the semester, excluding summer semesters or sessions, immediately following the first anniversary of the date that the student graduated from high school.
(b) To be eligible for a continuing TOPS-Tech Transfer Award as provided in R.S. 17:5002(D)(2)(b), the student shall transfer to and enroll in an eligible college or university not later than the semester, excluding summer semesters or sessions, immediately following the first anniversary of the date that the student graduated from his initial institution.
C. Notwithstanding any provision of Subsection B of this Section, any student who meets all applicable initial and continuing program eligibility requirements of this Chapter for ant a TOPS-Tech Transfer, Opportunity, Performance, or Honors Award may use such award at an out-of-state nonpublic college or university when each of the following conditions is met:
§5029. Alternative initial eligibility requirements

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C. A student who graduates from an out-of-country high school shall be eligible to receive an Opportunity, or TOPS-Tech, or TOPS-Tech Transfer Award pursuant to this Chapter if each of the following conditions is met:
§5041. Maintaining eligibility; Honors, Performance, Opportunity; TOPS-Transfer
To maintain continued state payment of an amount equal to tuition and other amounts for ant a TOPS-Transfer, Opportunity, Performance, or Honors Award pursuant to this Chapter once enrolled in college a student shall meet all of the following:
(3) For students qualifying for an Opportunity Award, have a cumulative grade point average of the following as evaluated at the end of each academic year:
(a) At least $2.30 \underline{2.50}$ calculated on a 4.00 scale after completion of twentyfour hours of credit.
(b) At least $2.50 \underline{2.75}$ calculated on a 4.00 scale after completion of fortyeight hours of credit.
(4) For students qualifying for a TOPS-Tech Transfer Award, have a cumulative grade point average of the following as evaluated at the end of each academic year:
(a) At least 2.50 calculated on a 4.00 scale after completion of twenty-four hours of credit.
(b) At least 2.75 calculated on a 4.00 scale after completion of forty-eight hours of credit. This minimum grade point average requirement shall be a prerequisite for continuation of a student's TOPS-Tech Transfer Award upon his $\underline{\text { transfer from his initial institution to his subsequent institution as provided in R.S. }}$ 17:5002(D)(2)(b).
(4)(a)(5)(a) For students qualifying to receive a Performance or an Honors Award, have a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.00 on a 4.00 scale at the end of each academic year.
(b) However, if at any time an otherwise eligible student receiving a Performance Award or an Honors Award in accordance with the provisions of this Chapter fails to have a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.00 on a 4.00 scale at the end of any academic year but has and continues to maintain a cumulative grade point average at least equal to that required by Paragraph (3) of this Subsection for continued participation by a recipient of an Opportunity Award, the student receiving a Performance Award or an Honors Award shall remain eligible for state payments but only in the amount provided for in R.S. 17:5002(B) for a recipient of an Opportunity Award. The provisions of this Subparagraph shall apply to all students who receive state payments pursuant to a Performance Award or an Honors Award, including all such students from the beginning of the program.
(5)(6) Have no criminal conviction, except for misdemeanor traffic violations and, if the student has been in the United States Armed Forces and has separated from such service, has received an honorable discharge or general discharge under honorable conditions.
§5041.1. Maintaining eligibility; Honors, Performance, Opportunity; exceptions
Notwithstanding R.S. 17:5041(3), to maintain continued state payment of an amount equal to tuition for an Opportunity Award pursuant to this Chapter once enrolled in college, a student who graduated from high school prior to the 2019-2020 school year shall have a cumulative grade point average of the following as evaluated at the end of each academic year:
(1) At least 2.30 calculated on a 4.00 scale after completion of twenty-four hours of credit.
(2) At least 2.50 calculated on a 4.00 scale after completion of forty-eight hours of credit.

Section 2. R.S. 17:5024(A)(2) and (3)(b), (B)(2), and (C) are hereby repealed in their entirety.

Abstract: Creates a new Taylor Opportunity Program for Students (TOPS) award, the
TOPS-Tech Transfer Award, available for two years in pursuit of skill or occupational training and for two years in pursuit of a baccalaureate degree.

## Taylor Opportunity Program for Students (TOPS), generally

Present law provides for the Taylor Opportunity Program for Students (TOPS) as a program of merit scholarships for students attending certain postsecondary education institutions who meet specific grade point average, ACT score, and core curriculum requirements and certain other qualifications. Provides for Opportunity, Performance and Honors Awards (eight semesters) and TOPS-Tech Awards (two years).

## Establishment of a new TOPS Award

Proposed law creates a new TOPS award, the TOPS-Tech Transfer Award. Provides that a student who receives this award shall receive the equivalent of a TOPS-Tech Award for his first two years of postsecondary education and, if he meets certain criteria, the equivalent of an Opportunity Award for his remaining four semesters. Provides that the first cohort of students eligible for such an award shall be those graduating from high school in the 2019-20 school year (in other words, students entering high school in the fall of 2016).

## Baseline award amounts and maximum award duration

Present law provides relative to the amount awarded for recipients of a TOPS-Tech Award, which is only awarded if a student is enrolled in programs aligned to state workforce priorities as determined by the Bd. of Regents and La. Workforce Investment Council:

Proposed law retains present law and provides that a student qualifying for a TOPS-Tech Transfer Award who enrolls at an institution at which a student may use a TOPS-Tech award shall receive an award amount at the TOPS-Tech Award level.

Present law provides as follows relative to the amount awarded to recipients of Opportunity, Performance, or Honors awards:

| La. public college or university | Tuition charged by the institution |

Proposed law retains present law and adds that upon transferring to an institution at which a student may use an Opportunity Award, the recipient of a TOPS-Tech Transfer Award shall receive an award amount at the Opportunity Award level.

Present law allows a student receiving an Opportunity, Performance, or Honors Award who graduates in less than eight semesters to continue to receive award benefits to pursue a postgraduate academic degree, subject to certain limitations and requirements. Proposed law grants this same opportunity to recipients of a TOPS-Tech Transfer Award.

Present law provides for a tuition exemption for persons serving in the La. National Guard and provides that in lieu of payment of tuition through a TOPS Award, they shall receive this tuition exemption; also grants them a stipend based on whether they qualify for an Opportunity or TOPS-Tech Award ( $\$ 300$ per semester $/ \$ 600$ per academic year) or a Performance or Honors Award (\$700 per semester/\$1400 per academic year).

Proposed law grants such persons who qualify for the TOPS-Tech Transfer Award the same stipend granted to those who qualify for an Opportunity or TOPS-Tech Award.

## Initial eligibility requirements

All proposed law revisions to initial eligibility requirements are applicable to students graduating from high school during or after the 2019-2020 school year.

ACT:
Present law requires that for an Opportunity Award, a student must attain an ACT score that is at least equal to the state's average score but never less than 20. Proposed law instead applies this ACT score requirement to the TOPS-Tech Transfer Award; provides that the minimum score for an Opportunity Award is 21.

Present law requires at least a 23 for the Performance Award, at least a 27 for the Honors Award, and at least a 17 for the TOPS-Tech Award. Proposed law retains present law.

Grade point average (GPA):
Present law requires a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.50 for a TOPS-Tech or Opportunity Award and a 3.00 for a Performance or Honors Award. Proposed law raises the minimum GPA for the Opportunity Award from 2.50 to 3.00 and otherwise retains present law.

Core curriculum:

Present law provides one set of core curriculum requirements for Opportunity, Performance, and Honors Awards and another for the TOPS-Tech Award. Proposed law requires TOPSTech Transfer Award recipients to meet the core curriculum requirements applicable to Opportunity, Performance, and Honors Award recipients.

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## Postsecondary education institution enrollment

Present law provides that to be eligible for any TOPS Award, a student shall enroll in an eligible college or university as a first-time freshman not later than the semester, excluding summer semesters or sessions, immediately following the first anniversary of his high school graduation.

Proposed law applies this deadline to those qualifying for a TOPS-Tech Transfer Award and further provides that in order for such award to continue upon his completion of skill or occupational training, he shall transfer to and enroll in an eligible college or university not later than the semester, excluding summer semesters or sessions, immediately following the first anniversary of the date that he graduated from his initial institution.

## Maintaining eligibility

Present law provides general requirements for maintaining eligibility for all TOPS Awards. Requires maintaining a minimum GPA. For students qualifying for an Opportunity Award, present law requires a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.30 after 24 credit hours and 2.50 after 48 credit hours. Proposed law, applicable to students graduating from high school during or after the 2019-2020 school year, increases these minimum GPA requirements from 2.30 to 2.50 and from 2.50 to 2.75 , respectively; also applies them to continuing eligibility for a TOPS-Tech Transfer Award, specifying that a student must have at least a 2.75 upon graduation from his initial institution in order for his award to continue upon transfer to his subsequent institution.
(Amends R.S. 17:5002(A), (D), (E), and (G)(1), 5024(A)(1)(intro. para.) and(a) and (B)(1)(intro para.) and (a), 5025(intro. para.), $5027(\mathrm{~A})(1)$ and (C)(intro. para.), 5029(C)(intro. para.), and 5041(intro. para.), (3), (4), and (5); Adds R.S. 17:5024(A)(1)(e) and (B)(1)(e), 5024.1, 5041(6) and 5041.1; Repeals R.S. 17:5024(A)(2) and (3)(b), (B)(2), and (C))
