1	AN ACT
2	To enact R.S. 17:266, relative to required courses of instruction; to require that cursive
3	writing be taught in public schools; and to provide for related matters.
4	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
5	Section 1. R.S. 17:266 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
6	§266. Cursive writing; required instruction
7	Beginning with the 2016-2017 school year, cursive writing shall be taught
8	in all public schools at the appropriate grade levels.
9	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
10	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
11	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
12	vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
13	effective on the day following such approval.
