COURTS: Provides for public contempt proceedings

2	To enact Code of Civil Procedure Article 228, relative to contempt proceedings, to provide
3	for public proceedings for civil and criminal contempt; and to provide for related
4	matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. Code of Civil Procedure Article 228 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
7	Art. 228. Public Contempt Proceedings
8	A. No person alleged to have committed any act or omission constituting
9	direct or constructive contempt of court, whether the act or omission is alleged to
10	constitute civil contempt or criminal contempt, shall be tried or punished by any
11	court except in proceedings open to the public, notwithstanding any other law to the
12	contrary, or the lawful exclusion of the public from other aspects of, or hearings in,
13	the same litigation.
14	B. All court pleadings, court records, and evidence upon which any direct or
15	constructive civil or criminal contempt prosecution is based shall be open to the
16	public.
17	C. The provisions of this Article shall not apply if all parties to a civil case
18	in which the contempt allegation arises stipulate that the proceedings or records may
19	be closed to the public, and the hearings and records are the type available for sealing

under applicable statutes. However, no court shall in any way require or promote the

waiver of the rights to public access provided in this Article.

Abstract: Requires all proceedings on direct or constructive contempt of court to be open to the public unless the parties stipulate otherwise.

Present law provides procedures for hearings on contempt of court charges.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires that hearings on contempt of court charges be open to the public unless the parties stipulate that they may be closed to the public.
