PORTS/HARBORS/TERMINALS: Changes the composition of the Avoyelles Parish Port Commission and provides for additional authority of the commission

AN ACT

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 34:1801, 1803, 1806, and 1807, relative to the Avoyelles Parish
3	Port Commission; to rename the Avoyelles Parish Port Commission; to provide for
4	the membership of the Avoyelles Parish Port Commission; to provide for the powers
5	and duties of the Avoyelles Parish Port Commission; and to provide for related
6	matters.
7	Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published
8	as provided by Article III, Section 13 of the Constitution of
9	Louisiana.
0	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
1	Section 1. R.S. 34:1801, 1803, 1806, and 1807 are hereby amended and reenacted
12	to read as follows:
13	CHAPTER 15. AVOYELLES PARISH PORT AND WATERWAY COMMISSION
4	§1801. Creation of Avoyelles Parish Port and Waterway Commission
15	A. There is hereby created a commission to be known as the Avoyelles
16	Parish Port and Waterway Commission, which shall be composed of seven members
17	who shall serve without compensation and who shall be appointed as follows:
18	(a) Four commissioners appointed by the governing authority of the parish
19	of Avoyelles;

3	(c) One commissioner shall be elected by the appointed commissioners a
4	their initial meeting.
5	The commissioner initially elected by the appointed commissioners, and one
6	of the four commissioners initially appointed by the governing authority of the parish
7	of Avoyelles, and one of the two commissioners initially appointed by the governing
8	authority of the town of Simmesport, shall be appointed for a term of two years. One
9	of the four commissioners initially appointed by the governing authority of the parish
10	of Avoyelles, and one of the two commissioners initially appointed by the governing
11	authority of the town of Simmesport shall serve for four years; and the remaining
12	commissioners shall be appointed for a term of six years. Thereafter, the successors
13	to each of such commissioners shall be appointed for terms of six years. nine
14	members domiciled in each police jury district who shall serve without compensation
15	and who shall be appointed, subject to Senate confirmation, by the representative
16	representing House District Twenty Eight and the senator representing Senator
17	District Twenty Eight.
18	B. Any vacancy on the commission for any reason shall be filled in the same
19	manner as the original appointments and for the unexpired term of office. Each
20	commissioner shall be a citizen of the United States, and a qualified voter and a
21	taxpayer of the State of Louisiana.

23	§1803. Rights and powers of the board
24	A. The commission shall exercise the powers herein conferred upon it
25	within the port area, consisting of the entire parish of Avoyelles as the boundaries
26	and limits of said parish are presently fixed by law.
27	B. The commission may authorize a reasonable travel allowance for its
28	members in the performance of their official duties, and it may employ such officers
29	or agents, and employees, as it may find necessary in the performance of its duties

(b) Two commissioners shall be appointed by the governing authority of the

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and may prescribe their duties, powers and compensation of such officers, agents, and employees. The commission may, upon such terms as it may agree upon, contract for legal, financial, engineering and other professional services necessary or expedient in the conduct of its affairs, and may upon terms and conditions mutually agreeable, utilize the services of the other executive departments of the state.

C. The commission shall regulate the commerce, and traffic, within such port area in such a manner as may, in its judgment, be for the best interest of the state. It shall have charge of and administer public wharves, docks, sheds and landings, and shall have authority to construct or acquire and equip wharves and landings, and other structures useful for the commerce of the port area, and provide mechanical facilities therefor; to erect sheds or other structures on said wharves and landings; to maintain proper depths of water at all such wharves and landings; to provide light, water, police protection and other services for its facilities as it may deem advisable; to construct or acquire, maintain and operate basins, locks, canals, warehouses and elevators; to charge for the use of all facilities administered by it, and for all services rendered by it, such fees, rates, tariffs, or other charges as it may establish; to establish harbor lines within the port area by agreement with the Corps of Engineers; and to construct, own, operate and maintain terminal rail facilities, and other common carrier rail facilities for the purpose of rendering rail transportation to and from the facilities to be erected, owned and operated by the commission in both intrastate and interstate commerce. The legislature may confer additional powers upon the commission not inconsistent with the provisions hereof; provided, however, that it shall not impair any contracts lawfully entered into by the commission. Title to all property and improvements thereon operated by the commission shall vest in the state of Louisiana.

<u>D.</u> The commission may charge a reasonable fee to each vessel arriving in the port area in ballast or carrying cargo of any kind. It may also charge for each copy of any certificate issued by it, or by any of its officers or employees for

inspecting hatches, surveying cargo, or making other surveys or inspections of vessels in the port area, but shall furnish, without charge, to the master of each such vessel, one copy of all surveys upon his vessel or cargo.

<u>E.</u> The commission shall have authority to make and enter into contracts, leases, and other agreements with railroads, trucking companies, barge lines, and with any and all companies interested in the transportation, storage and shipping of goods and other products, whether by rail, truck line, barge line, ocean going vessels, or otherwise for the use of facilities administered by the commission or any part or portion thereof for a period of time not exceeding forty years. No exclusive franchise, however, shall be granted to any carrier.

F. The commission shall manage withdrawals of water from Spring Bayou.

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§1806. Right to expropriate

The Avoyelles Parish Port <u>and Waterway</u> Commission may acquire by expropriation in accordance with expropriation laws of the state of Louisiana, any wharves, landings or any other property necessary for the benefit and advantage of the commerce of the said commission.

§1807. Advertisement; R.S. 43:111 not to apply

The prohibition, contained in R.S. 43:111, against advertising in any newspaper, book, pamphlet or periodical, shall not apply to the Avoyelles Parish Port and Waterway Commission in carrying out its functions and duties under the constitution and laws of this state.

Section 2. The commissioners of the Avoyelles Parish Port Commission in office on the effective date shall remain as commissioners until such time as appointments are made pursuant to this Act.

Section 3. The Avoyelles Parish Port and Waterway Commission is hereby assigned and subsumes all of the duties and responsibilities previously exercised by the Avoyelles Parish Port Commission with regard to previously executed agreements and contracts, the

1 purposes of which are under the duties, jurisdiction, responsibilities, and powers granted to 2 the Avoyelles Parish Port and Waterway Commission. The Avoyelles Parish Port and 3 Waterway Commission is here given the power to execute, sign, modify, amend, and renew 4 any such agreement on its own behalf or on behalf of the Avoyelles Parish Port Commission. 5 Section 4. All unfinished business, references in laws and documents, employees, 6 property, obligations, and books and records of the prior plans, projects, policies, and 7 programs assumed by this Act into the Avoyelles Parish Port and Waterway Commission 8 shall be transferred as provided in this Act. Any pending or unfinished business of the prior 9 plans, projects, policies, and programs shall be taken over and be completed by the 10 Avoyelles Parish Port and Waterway Commission created by this Act with the same power 11 and authorization as that of prior plans, projects, policies, and programs and the new port and 12 waterway authority shall be the successor in every way to the prior plans, projects, policies, 13 and programs for the purpose of completing such business. Any reference in laws and 14 documents to either of the prior plans, projects, policies, and programs shall be deemed to 15 apply to the new Avoyelles Parish Port and Waterway Commission. Any legal proceeding 16 to which the prior plans, projects, policies, and programs are a party and which is filed, 17 initiated, or pending before any court on the effective date of this Act, and all documents 18 involved in or affected by said legal proceeding, shall retain their effectiveness and shall be 19 continued in the name of the Avoyelles Parish Port and Waterway Commission . All further 20 legal proceedings and documents in the continuation, disposition, and enforcement of such 21 legal proceeding shall be in the name of the Avoyelles Parish Port and Waterway 22 Commission, and the Avoyelles Parish Port and Waterway Commission shall be substituted 23 for the prior plans, projects, policies, and programs without necessity for amendment of any 24 document. This Act shall not be construed so as to impair the effectiveness of any rule or 25 policy of either of the prior plans, projects, policies, and programs and any such rule or 26 policy shall remain effective as provided therein or until changed in accordance with law. 27 This Act shall not be construed so as to impair the contractual or other obligations of either 28 of the prior plans, projects, policies, and programs or of the state of Louisiana. All 29 obligations of the prior plans, projects, policies, and programs shall be the obligations of the

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new Avoyelles Parish Port and Waterway Commission. The new Avoyelles Parish Port and Waterway Commission shall be the successor in every way to the prior plans, projects, policies, and programs, including all of their obligations and debts. All dedications and allocations of revenues and sources of revenues heretofore made to or for either of the prior plans, projects, policies, and programs shall continue in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes as were provided prior to the enactment of this Act, unless and until other provision is made therefor. All books, papers, records, money, actions, and other property of every kind, movable and immovable, real and personal, heretofore possessed, controlled, or used by either of the prior plans, projects, policies, and programs are hereby transferred to the new Avoyelles Parish Port and Waterway Commission. All employees heretofore engaged in the performance of duties of the prior plans, projects, policies, and programs, insofar as practicable and necessary, are transferred to the new Avoyelles Parish Port and Waterway Commission and insofar as practicable and necessary shall continue to perform the duties heretofore performed, subject to policies and procedures of the new Avoyelles Parish Port and Waterway Commission, applicable state civil service laws, rules, and regulations, and other applicable laws. Subject to such laws, positions in the unclassified service shall remain in the unclassified service. Section 5. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on the day following such approval.

Abstract: Changes the name and governing body of the Avoyelles Parish Port Commission and adds that the commission shall mange withdrawals of water from Spring Bayou.

Present law creates the Avoyelles Parish Port Commission.

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<u>Proposed law</u> changes the name of that commission to the Avoyelles Parish Port and Waterway Commission.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the Avoyelles Parish Port Commission is composed of seven members who shall serve without compensation and who shall be appointed as follows:

- (1) Four commissioners appointed by the governing authority of the parish of Avoyelles.
- (2) Two commissioners shall be appointed by the governing authority of the town of Simmesport.
- (3) One commissioner shall be elected by the appointed commissioners at their initial meeting.

<u>Present law</u> provides that commissioners are appointed for terms of six years.

<u>Proposed law</u> removes <u>present law</u> and instead provides that the commission will be composed of nine members who shall serve without compensation and who shall be appointed, subject to Senate confirmation, by the representative representing House District 28 and the senator representing Senate District 28. Requires a person domiciled in each police jury district be appointed to the commission.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the rights and duties of the commission.

<u>Proposed law</u> adds that the commission will manage withdrawals of water from Spring Bayou.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for transitional provisions to complete the transfer of all obligations, rights, duties, property, and the like from the existing Avoyelles Parish Port Commission to the proposed Avoyelles Parish Port and Waterway Commission.
