20	(ii) Out-of-school suspensions, broken down by categories of ten days or
21	less and more than ten days.
22	(iii) In-school expulsions, broken down by categories of ten days or less
23	and more than ten days.
24	(iv) Out-of-school suspensions, broken down by categories of ten days
25	or less and more than ten days.
26	(v) Restraint procedures.
27	(vi) Seclusion procedures.
28	(vii) Unilateral removals to an interim alternative educational setting by
29	school personnel by disability classification and by reason for removal.

	the provisions of R.S. 17:3914.	
	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signa	ature by the governor or, if not
signed	by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to	become law without signature
by the	governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the	Constitution of Louisiana. If
vetoe	by the governor and subsequently approved by the leg	islature, this Act shall become
effect	ve on the day following such approval.

Present law provides that the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE) annually publish revenue and expenditure data in an easily understandable format on the Department of Education website. Further provides for the type of data to be reported.

Proposed law retains present law and additionally requires that the annual report by BESE to include student membership counts and any weighted student counts by student need characteristics, calculations of the amounts of minimum foundation program funding allocated to each school system through the minimum foundation program, amounts provided to and removed from calculations for each city, parish, or other local public school board including the source of funding shifts between school systems, expenditures of funds by city, parish, or other local public school board relative to the amounts generated by the weighted student characteristics and factors by the formula applied to city, parish, or other local public school board.

Present law provides that the department of education collect and report on certain student

data.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u>. Additionally, requires the annual collection and publication of reports on students with exceptionalities. The information collected and reported shall include breakouts of speech or language impairment category and breakouts of intellectual disability categories, not including students with gifted and talented exclusively, by city, parish, or other local public school board. The data for each disability classifications shall be reported in total as well as unduplicated counts by race, gender, age and sex.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
