SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 6

BY SENATOR BARROW

HEALTH CARE. Directs the Department of Health and Hospitals to evaluate and report on funding solutions for in-home support providers.

1	A RESOLUTION
2	To direct the Department of Health and Hospitals to evaluate and report on funding solutions
3	for in-home support providers.
4	WHEREAS, community based in-home support providers are a fundamental
5	component of the health care spectrum as more and more individuals seek community based
6	care as opposed to institutionalization; and
7	WHEREAS, this provider group has been disproportionally jeopardized by a series
8	of rate reductions and unfunded mandates over the past several years; and
9	WHEREAS, since 2010, in-home support providers have suffered a 23% rate
10	reduction while other institutional providers have experienced marginal rate reductions or
11	no reductions at all, making the current in-home provider rate less than the provider rate in
12	2008; and
13	WHEREAS, in 2016 the Affordable Care Act required in-home support providers
14	to offer health insurance to 95% of agency employees without the provision of state or
15	federal dollars to cover the mandate; and
16	WHEREAS, also in 2016, the U.S. Department of Labor overtime rule became
17	effective requiring in-home support providers to begin paying overtime rates to their
18	employees without the provision of state or federal dollars to cover the mandate; and

1	WHEREAS, it is estimated that for a mid-size agency, which a majority of in-home
2	support providers are, the costs of implementing these unfunded mandates could be nearly
3	half a million dollars; and
4	WHEREAS, because of the rate reductions and unfunded mandates, a recent survey
5	by the Supported Living Network documented that nearly three quarters of the three hundred
6	current in-home support providers are facing bankruptcy, closure or elimination within the
7	next six months; and
8	WHEREAS, this puts employment of thirty thousand direct support workers at risk
9	of unemployment and will leave more than twenty thousand individuals with disabilities and
10	seniors without in-home care, placing them at risk of institutionalization; and
11	WHEREAS, other provider groups have been much more favored by the department
12	and have not sustained the rate reductions borne by in-home support providers without any
13	regard to this provider group's ability to sustain such rate reductions and unfunded mandates;
14	and
15	WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the Department of Health and Hospitals to
16	ensure that their reimbursement rates are adequate to maintain an appropriate provider
17	network to care for individuals with disabilities and seniors in the community.
18	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana
19	does hereby direct the Department of Health and Hospitals to evaluate and report on funding
20	solutions for in-home support providers.
21	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the report shall include data on the rate
22	reductions of in-home support providers versus rate reductions to institutional nursing home
23	providers, by year, since 2008, and should also include data on all of the unfunded mandates
24	being thrust upon this provider group.
25	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the report shall include a detailed plan
26	identifying realistic funding strategies and solutions that can be implemented for this
27	provider group and a time line for implementation to ensure sustainability of the services
28	they provide to the individuals who rely on them the most.
29	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the department shall submit a report of its

findings and recommendations to the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana no later than
