4	WHEREAS, it is with profound sadness that the members of the Legislature of
5	Louisiana have learned of the death of Bob Gene Haynie on February 14, 2016, at the age
6	of eighty-seven; and
7	WHEREAS, Bob Gene Haynie was born on October 23, 1928, in Dewey, Oklahoma,
8	to George Lee and Leila "Sissy" Belle; and
9	WHEREAS, in 1946, Mr. Haynie graduated from Pampa High School in Pampa,
10	Texas; after graduation, he moved to Fort Collins, Colorado, and became a certified
11	mechanic for John Deere; and
12	WHEREAS, in 1948, he joined the United States Air Force and was stationed at
13	Keesler Air Force Base in Biloxi, Mississippi, where he worked as a radar mechanic; and
14	WHEREAS, in November of 1950, Mr. Haynie met the love of his life, Celina
15	Machin, on a blind date in New Orleans; the couple married on January 6, 1951, and in
16	January of 2016, they celebrated their sixty-fifth wedding anniversary; and
17	WHEREAS, in 1952, Mr. Haynie was honorably discharged from the Air Force, and
18	he began a fulfilling career in the oilfield business for City Service; and
19	WHEREAS, he and his wife, Celina, moved throughout Louisiana and Mississippi
20	with their family before settling in Houma in 1956; and

1	WHEREAS, while living in Houma, Mr. Haynie served as Cub Master to Pack 385
2	and Scout Master to Pack 311 of Boys Scouts of America; he was awarded the Cub Master
3	of the Year Award and the Scout Master of the Year Award; and
4	WHEREAS, Mr. Haynie's exceptional leadership with Boy Scouts of America earned
5	him the Woods Badge, and he was inducted into the Boy Scouts of America National Honor
6	Society, the Order of the Arrow; and
7	WHEREAS, he helped design and build the first pinewood derby track in Houma;

9	WHEREAS, in 1970, Mr. Haynie and his family moved to Lafayette; he worked for
10	Forest Oil Corporation until his retirement in 1985; and
11	WHEREAS, throughout his life, he enjoyed woodworking, hunting, traveling with
12	his wife, spending time with family, and celebrating holidays; and
13	WHEREAS, Mr. Haynie is survived by his wife of sixty-five years, Celina; his sons
14	and daughters-in-law, Randy and Daynese, Bonnie, Mike and Mary and, Dale and Christine;
15	his daughter Barbara and her husband Bill; his grandchildren, Ellen Lejeune and her husband
16	Robert, Colleen Blanchet, Lenny Haynie, Ryan Haynie and his wife Alana, Dayna Haynie,
17	and Rachel French and her husband Jonathon; his great-grandchildren, Liam, Conner, Pierce,
18	Foster, Elise, Ainsley, Sidney, Hunter, and Juliette; his niece, Cheryl Haynie; and his
19	nephew, Hal Haynie; and
20	WHEREAS, he was preceded in death by his parents; his brother, Harold; and his
21	eldest sons, Bruce Gene and Alan Lee Haynie; and
22	WHEREAS, although the death of Bob Gene Haynie has left a tremendous void in
23	the state, his legacy shall forever remain in the minds and hearts of all who knew and loved
24	this extraordinary man.
