| 10 | petroleum products received, used, sold, or delivered within this state by him,           |
| 11 | together with invoices, bills of lading, and other pertinent records and papers as may    |
| 12 | be required by the commissioner for the reasonable administration of this Subpart         |
| 13 | until the taxes to which they relate have prescribed. All such records shall be opened    |
| 14 | for inspection to the commissioner at all reasonable hours. Failure to provide such       |
| 15 | records may result in a fine of up to ten thousand dollars.                               |

**Abstract:** Provides a penalty for failure to provide records of petroleum products received, used, sold, or delivered in the state.

<u>Present law</u> requires each dealer, distributor, or importer of petroleum products to keep a full and complete record of petroleum products received, used, sold, or delivered within this state.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides a penalty of up to \$10,000 for failure to provide required records in present law.
