HOUSE COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

2016 Regular Session

Substitute for Original House Bill No. 329 by Representative Marcelle as proposed by the House Committee on Transportation, Highways, and Public Works

This document reflects the content of a substitute bill but is not in a bill form; page numbers in this document DO NOT correspond to page numbers in the substitute bill itself.

To amend and reenact LAC 55:III.1569(C) and to enact R.S. 47:532.1(A)(7)(e), (f), and (g) and (E), relative to public license tag agents; to require licenses plates be made available to public license tag agents; to require for payment of production of such license plates and reimbursement of such payment; to require public license tag agents undertake certain actions; to provide relative to contracts between the Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of motor vehicles and public license tag agents; to amend administrative rules of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of motor vehicles, relating to contracts between the Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of motor vehicles and public license tag agents; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. R.S. 47:532.1(A)(7)(e), (f), and (g) and (E) are hereby enacted to read as follows:

§532.1. Public license tag agents; auto title companies; rules and regulations; surety bonds; fees

(7)

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(e) License plates shall be made available to each public license tag agent in increments of no less than ten. Public license tag agents shall advance the costs of production for the license plates prior to the receipt of the license plates. The Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of motor vehicles, shall fully

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reimburse the public license tag agent for the cost of the production of the plate when the plate is issued pursuant to any registration transaction performed by the public license tag agent. The Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of motor vehicles, shall determine the method by which the public license tag agent receives the reimbursement.

- (f) Public license tag agents shall submit images of documents required to be retained by the Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of motor vehicles, in connection with transactions or activities listed in this Paragraph or authorized by the commissioner pursuant to Subparagraph (d) of this Paragraph in the official document image repository of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of motor vehicles. The Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of motor vehicles, shall determine the manner in which public license tag agents shall be required to submit these images.
- (g) Notwithstanding any requirements of R.S. 47:505(B) to the contrary, all public license tag agents shall submit electronic notification to the Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of motor vehicles, of the removal and destruction of license plates when such submission is undertaken on behalf of a dealer licensed pursuant to Chapter 4-C or Chapter 6 of Title 32 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950. The Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of motor vehicles, shall determine the manner in which the public license tag agent shall be required to electronically submit this information.

E. The contract between the Department of Public Safety and Corrections,

office of motor vehicles and a person who contracts to perform services pursuant to

this Section shall be two years and may be automatically renewed by the

Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of motor vehicles.

Section 2. LAC 55:III.1569(C) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows: §1569. Contracts

* * *

C. The contract between the department and the public license tag agent shall have a term of one year two years. The department may provide for automatic renewals.

Section 3. A contract entered into between the Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of motor vehicles, and a public license tag agent in 2016 but prior to the effective date of this Act shall be extended for one year without need for amendment of the contract.

Section 4. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on the day following such approval.

Abstract: Requires public license tag agents to undertake certain duties and extends length of contracts for public license tag agents to two years.

<u>Present law</u> authorizes the commissioner to establish a system of public license tag agents to collect the registration license taxes. Specifies that the system is to consist of municipal and parish governing authorities or new motor vehicle dealers or their agents as well as authorized auto title companies.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that license plates will be made available to each public license tag agent in increments of no less than ten. Public license tag agents will advance the costs of production for the license plates prior to the receipt of the license plates. The Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of motor vehicles, (department) will fully reimburse the public license tag agent for the cost of the production of the plate when the plate is issued pursuant to any registration transaction performed by the public license tag agent. The department will determine the method by which the public license tag agent receives the reimbursement.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires public license tag agents to submit images of documents required to be retained by the department in connection with transactions or activities in connection with <u>present law</u> in the official document image repository of the department. The department will determine the manner in which public license tag agents will be required to submit these images.

<u>Present law</u> requires any dealer of motor vehicles who receives a previously owned vehicle with the intention of reselling such vehicle to remove the license plate from that vehicle and execute an affidavit attesting to that fact and attach said affidavit to the title and registration.

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CODING: Words in struck through type are deletions from existing law; words <u>underscored</u> are additions.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and requires all public license tag agents to submit electronic notification to the department of the removal and destruction of license plates when such submission is undertaken on behalf of a dealer licensed pursuant to <u>present law</u> (Chapter 4-C or Chapter 6 of Title 32 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950). The department will determine the manner in which the public license tag agent shall be required to electronically submit this information.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the contract between the department and a person who contracts to perform services of a public license tag agent shall be two years and may be automatically renewed by the department.

<u>Present LAC</u> 55:III.1569(C) provides that a contract between the department and the public license tag agent shall have a term of one year. The department may provide for automatic renewals.

Proposed LAC 55:III.1569(C) provides that the contract shall have a term of two years.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that a contract entered into between the department and a public license tag agent in 2016 but prior to the effective date of this Act shall be extended for one year without need for amendment of the contract.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
