LEGISLATIVE AUDITOR. Provides for actuarial notes on prefiled bills. (8/1/16)

AN ACT

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 24:521(B)(1), relative to the legislative auditor; to provide
3	relative to actuarial notes prepared by the legislative auditor; to provide for timing
4	requirements; and to provide for related matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 24:521(B)(1) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
7	§521. Actuarial notes
8	* * *
9	B.(1) Subject to the provisions of this Subsection, for each bill or resolution
10	for which an actuarial note is required as provided in Subsection A of this Section
11	a request for an actuarial note shall be presented to the legislative auditor who shall
12	have the duty to prepare the note as promptly as possible. The actuarial note for
13	any bill prefiled at least forty-five days prior to a regular session of the

legislature shall be completed and filed at least five days prior to the convening

of that session. Actuarial notes shall be prepared in the order of receipt of request

<u>Present law</u> provides that every bill, joint resolution, and simple or concurrent resolution introduced in the legislature which proposes a change in any state, municipal, or parochial retirement system funded wholly or partially with public funds shall at the time of its consideration, have attached an actuarial note, which is a brief explanation of the financial or actuarial effect of the proposed change. Requires the author to present the instrument to the legislative auditor with a request that he prepare the actuarial note and the actuarial note be prepared as promptly as possible. Requires that the actuarial note be factual and concise, providing an estimate in dollars of the impact of the proposed change, and shall not include any opinion related to the merits of the proposed change.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and further provides that the actuarial note for any bill prefiled at least 45 days prior to a regular session of the legislature shall be completed and filed at least five days prior to the convening of that session.

Effective August 1, 2016.
