CHILDREN/FOSTER CARE: Provides relative to transportation of children to be admitted to a treatment facility under a physician's emergency commitment certificate

AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact Children's Code Article 1431(D) and to enact Children's Code Article 3 1427(C), relative to minors who are mentally ill or suffering from substance abuse 4 and in need of immediate medical treatment; to provide relative to procedures 5 pursuant to issuance of a physician's emergency certificate for treatment of a minor; 6 to provide relative to transportation of a child in whose name an emergency 7 certificate has been issued; to authorize certain persons to accompany the child 8 during such transportation; and to provide for related matters. 9 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: 10 Section 1. Children's Code Article 1431(D) is hereby amended and reenacted and 11 Children's Code Article 1427(C) is hereby enacted to read as follows: 12 Art. 1427. Authority to transport and detain 13 14 C.(1) In addition to other persons authorized by this Article to transport to 15 a treatment facility a child in whose name an emergency certificate has been issued, 16 any of the following persons may also accompany the child during such 17 transportation: (a) A parent, including a foster parent, subject to the conditions of Paragraph 18 19 (2) of this Subarticle.

Abstract: Authorizes certain persons to accompany a minor suffering from mental illness or substance abuse during transportation to a treatment facility pursuant to a physician's emergency certificate for treatment.

<u>Present law</u> provides for procedures pursuant to the issuance of a physician's emergency certificate for treatment of a minor suffering from mental illness or substance abuse. Provides that, if necessary, peace officers shall apprehend and transport, or ambulance services, under appropriate circumstances, may locate and transport a minor patient on whom an emergency certificate has been completed to a treatment facility.

Proposed law retains present law, and adds thereto an authorization for any of the following persons to accompany the minor during transportation to a treatment facility:

- A parent, including a foster parent. (1)
- (2) A legal guardian.
- (3) A Department of Children and Family Services case worker.

Proposed law stipulates that a biological parent of a child in foster care shall only accompany the child if approved by the Department of Children and Family Services.
