Substitute for Original House Bill No. 433 by Representative Hazel as proposed by the House Committee on Transportation, Highways, and Public Works

This document reflects the content of a substitute bill but is not in a bill form; page numbers in this document DO NOT correspond to page numbers in the substitute bill itself.

To amend and reenact R.S. 32:414(R)(3), relative to economic hardship licenses; to authorize the issuance of economic hardship licenses, related to state tax delinquency; to establish the duration of such economic hardship licenses; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. R.S. 32:414(R)(3) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows: §414. Suspension, revocation, renewal, and cancellation of licenses; judicial review

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(3) The Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of motor vehicles, shall not issue an economic hardship license, for a period of two years or until such time as the applicant paid or made payment arrangements as described in Paragraph (2) of this Subsection, whichever occurs first, when an individual's driver's license is suspended and has not been renewed under the provisions of this Section.

Abstract: Establishes the duration of economic hardship licenses, related to state tax delinquency, issued by the Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of motor vehicles as a period of two years or until such time as the applicant paid or made payment arrangements.

<u>Present law</u> prohibits the Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections, office of motor vehicles from issuing an economic hardship license to a person whose driver's license is suspended and has not been renewed because of delinquent state taxes.

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CODING: Words in struck through type are deletions from existing law; words <u>underscored</u> are additions.

<u>Proposed law</u> modifies <u>present law</u> by authorizing the Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections, office of motor vehicles to issue an economic hardship license to a person whose driver's license is suspended and has not been renewed because of delinquent state taxes. Specifies that such license is valid for a period of two years or until such time as the applicant paid or made payment arrangements as discussed in <u>present law</u>.
