2	To amend and reenact R.S. 9:4276(A)(2), relative to arbitration; to provide certain terms,
3	conditions, exceptions, requirements, definitions, and procedures; to provide that the
4	recognition or enforcement of an arbitral award may be refused if the award is
5	contrary to law; and to provide for related matters.
6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
7	Section 1. R.S. 9:4276(A)(2) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
8	§4276. Grounds for refusing recognition or enforcement
9	A. Recognition or enforcement of an arbitral award, irrespective of the
10	country in which it was made, may be refused only:
11	* * *
12	(2) If the court finds that:
13	(a) The subject matter of the dispute is not capable of settlement by
14	arbitration under the law of this state; or
15	(b) The recognition or enforcement of the award would be contrary to the
16	public policy of this state.: or
17	(c) That the arbitration award is contrary to law.

1 * * *

Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on the day following such approval.
