**Abstract:** Increases fines for violations of the compulsory seat belt law.

<u>Present law</u> provides that a person who violates <u>present law</u> subsequent to Aug. 31, 1995 and prior to Nov. 1, 1995 must be issued a warning ticket only.

<u>Proposed law</u> removes <u>present law</u>.

<u>Present law</u> provides that any person who violates <u>present law</u> subsequent to Oct. 31, 1995 must be subject to certain penalties.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but removes the reference to the expired time period provided in present law.

<u>Present law</u> provides that upon conviction of a first offense, the fine shall be \$25, including all costs of court.

Proposed law increases the fine from \$25 to \$50.

<u>Present law</u> provides that upon conviction of a second offense, the fine shall be \$50, including all costs of court.

Proposed law increases the fine from \$50 to \$75.

<u>Present law</u> provides that upon conviction of a third offense and any subsequent offense, the fine shall be \$50, plus all costs of court.

Proposed law increases the fine from \$50 to \$75.

## Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

## The House Floor Amendments to the engrossed bill:

1. Remove references to expired time periods provided in <u>present law</u> that governed the issuance of warning tickets only, instead of fines, for violations of <u>present law</u>.
