From revenues of the Assessment Districts in Assumption, Iberville, and Pointe Coupee parishes, the assessor in each of these parishes may receive an 21 22 automobile expense allowance not to exceed fifteen percent of his annual salary if 23 the allowance is approved by a majority of the voters of the parish voting in an election held for that purpose and provided that the assessor maintains three hundred 24 25 thousand dollars of automobile insurance per accident for bodily injury and one 26 hundred thousand dollars of automobile insurance per accident for property damage. 27 The expense allowance shall come from existing funds of the assessment district and 28 at no additional expense to the state or local governing authority.

B. The proposition seeking approval of the electors for the assessor to
 receive an automobile expense allowance shall be included on the ballot of a
 gubernatorial primary or general election or a congressional primary or general
 election."
