Amendments proposed by Senator Martiny to Original Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 32 by Senator Colomb

1 AMENDMENT NO. 1

2 3	On page 1, line 2, after "To" delete the remainder of the line and delete lines 3 through 17 and insert:
4 5 6	"urge and request the president of the Senate and the speaker of the House of Representatives to study the feasibility of providing closed captioning of legislative proceedings that occur in the State Capitol.
7 8 9	WHEREAS, hearing loss is among the most common problems in our population, with more than ten percent of Americans suffering from some sort of hearing impairment; and
10 11 12	WHEREAS, closed captioning allows persons with hearing impairments to have access to television programming by displaying the audio portion of a television program as text on the television screen; and
13 14	WHEREAS, currently there is audio and video of the legislative proceedings occurring in Senate and House committee rooms; and
15 16	WHEREAS, currently there is audio and video of the legislative proceedings occurring in the Senate and House Chamber; and
17 18 19	WHEREAS, the same such curiosity should be extended to constituents so that they are privy to legislative proceedings and may be actively involved in the legislative process; and
20 21	WHEREAS, the first use of closed captioning on televisions in America began in 1980; and
22 23 24	WHEREAS, the Television Decoder Circuitry Act of 1990 was passed by Congress giving the Federal Communications Commission the power to enact rules on the implementation of closed captioning; and
25 26 27	WHEREAS, it is important that we utilize technology in the most efficient way to enhance communication with constituents that are hearing impaired so that they will have equal access to the political process; and
28 29 30	WHEREAS, the stated purpose of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) is to provide a clear and comprehensive national mandate for the elimination of discrimination against individuals with disabilities; and
31 32	WHEREAS, to achieve the goals of the ADA, state government services must be equally accessible to individuals with disabilities; and
33 34 35	WHEREAS, the state of Louisiana provides internet streamed legislative sessions and hearings, but fails to offer closed captioning for the hearing impaired; and
36 37 38	WHEREAS, there are nearly 2,804,831 deaf citizens, and over 78,451 citizens with hearing impairments in Louisiana who could benefit from closed captioning.
