Substitute for Original House Bill No. 720 by Representative Garofalo as proposed by the House Committee on Judiciary

This document reflects the content of a substitute bill but is not in a bill form; page numbers in this document DO NOT correspond to page numbers in the substitute bill itself.

To amend and reenact R.S. 13:844(D)(2), relative to clerks of courts; to provide for recordation requirements; to provide relative to noncompliance of recordation requirements; to remove noncompliance fees; to impose certain restrictions; to provide relative to the effect of recordation of certain instruments; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. R.S. 13:844(D)(2) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows: §844. Fees of ex officio recorders

* * *

* * *

(2) For any document not in compliance with Paragraph (1), there shall be an additional ten-dollar noncompliance fee per document. Clerks of the district courts as ex officio recorders shall not refuse to record an instrument because it does not comply with Paragraph (1) of this Subsection. Noncompliance with the provisions of Paragraph (1) of this Subsection shall not impair the validity of an instrument or the effect given to its recordation.

Section 2. The provisions of this Act shall become effective on October 1, 2016.

Abstract: Prohibits clerks of district courts from refusing to record instruments for noncompliance with recordation requirements.

<u>Present law</u> provides that every document filed for recordation shall be captioned with the type of the act, a two-inch margin on the top, and a one-inch margin at the bottom and sides on the first page, with no less than an 8 point font.

<u>Present law</u> provides that any document in noncompliance with <u>present law</u> shall be charged a \$10 noncompliance fee per document.

<u>Proposed law</u> deletes the <u>present law</u> noncompliance fee and prohibits clerks of district court from refusing to record an instrument for noncompliance with the provisions of <u>present law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> further provides that documents in noncompliance with <u>present law</u> shall not invalidate the instrument or the effect given to its recordation.

Effective October 1, 2016.
